Transportation Services:

1. Enter description of transportation services offered to pupils, and how it will prioritize planned transportation services for pupils in transitional kindergarten, kindergarten, and any of grades 1 - 6 inclusive and pupils who are low income. Plan may provide for the LEA to partner with municipally owned transit system to provide services to middle and high school students. An LEA may provide no-cost transit passes to students. **The Governing Board desires to provide for the safe and efficient transportation of students to and from school as necessary to ensure student access to the educational program, promote regular attendance, and reduce tardiness. In determining the extent to which the District will provide transportation services, the Board shall weigh student and community needs against the cost of providing such services. The District is currently able to provide no charge transportation service to all eligible students who meet the minimum distance between their school established bus stop and the school defined as: Grades TK-3: 3/4 mile and Grades 4-8 : 1 mile. The District currently owns one bus and maintains one driver. There is one route that runs once in the morning and twice in the afternoon, to allow for ASES and extra-curricular activities. Additionally, the District owns 3 vans and one passenger vehicle. These vehicles are used for field trips, extra-curricular activities, and staff travel needs.**

2. Enter description of LEA's transportation services that would be accessible to pupils with disabilities, and homeless children and youth. **The Governing Board shall insure that appropriate transportation services are provided for students with disabilities as specified in their individualized education program (IEP) or accommodation plan. The district shall make home-to-school transportation available for students at no cost to parents/guardians as specified in the student's IEP. The Governing Board recognizes that foster and homeless youth may face significant barriers to achieving academic success due to their family circumstances, disruption to their educational program, and their emotional, social, and other health needs. To enable such students to achieve state and district academic standards, the Superintendent or designee shall provide them with full access to the district's educational program and implement strategies identified as necessary for the improvement of the academic achievement of foster youth in the district's local control and accountability plan (LCAP). This includes no charge transportation services from their school established bus stop to school.**

3. Enter description of how unduplicated pupils, would be able to access available home-to-school transportation at no-cost to the pupils. **Students receiving either General Education or Special Education transportation services, including Unduplicated Pupils, defined as; low socio-economic, English Learners or foster/homeless youth, will receive District transportation at no charge.**
