Free "STOP THE BLEED" Trainings Being Offered

Fairfield, CA –The Bay Area Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) has provided funding to offer free "STOP THE BLEED" trainings to the public and organizations in Solano and Napa Counties. These hands-on trainings provide essential skills to help participants recognize and respond to life-threatening bleeding emergencies, a crucial skill that can save lives before professional help arrives.

Participants will receive training from professionals at the Raytom Group and a complimentary STOP THE BLEED kit, empowering them with the tools and knowledge to act quickly in an emergency at work, home or in the community.
