The Raptor System works by digitally verifying that the visitor and the person on the ID document are the same. Each visitor is automatically screened against the registered sex


offender databases that Raptor maintains and keeps up to date for all 50 U.S. states and territories.

The system will scan your driver's license and also take a picture so please remember to bring your Government Issued ID when you come to volunteer. Once cleared, you will receive a personalized sticker to wear during your time on campus.

After your volunteer shift, you will then come back to the front office and scan your personalized sticker to sign out. So please do not dispose of the sticker prior to checking out at the front office. Thank you for helping keep our Cub's Safe!

Greenhills Reads is our school-wide shared reading experience. Each year, we come together around one book to celebrate the joy of





The Book:

This year, we are excited to announce our all-school read of <u>Wishtree by Katherine</u>

<u>Applegate</u>. Narrated by a wise, old oak tree named Red, this touching story explores themes of kindness, friendship, and belonging.

The Timeline:

Beginning October 13, we will read Wishtree as a Greenhills community over the course of two weeks. We will follow the reading schedule



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(Monday – Friday). The schedule will be printed on a bookmark we are sending home with the books

The Readers:

The intention of Greenhills Reads is for the book to be read aloud by an adult. Some of our older students will be able to read it independently, but the focus of the activity is for students to enjoy the story as it is read to them.

The Culmination:

To conclude our reading, students will participate in a special Wish Day. Each child will receive a tag to write a wish on and hang on our Greenhills Wishtree, creating a beautiful symbol of hope and community.

Note on Content:

In the story, a character named Samar and her family feel unwelcome in their neighborhood because of their Muslim faith and cultural background. While this is a central theme, it is presented in a gentle, age-appropriate way that encourages students to reflect on empathy, kindness, and friendship.

Preview & Opt-Out Option:

Parents are welcome to preview the book before our start date. If you prefer your child not participate in this year's Greenhills Reads selection, please let us know by **October 10th** so we can provide an alternate activity for your child during reading times.


