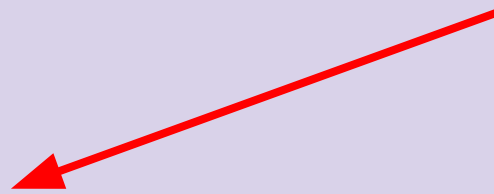

How is GPA Used?

- **What is “Recalculate”GPA?**
- **Students need to RESEARCH individual college policies**
 - **Admissions/Scholarships**
 - **Programs within a college - IE: Nursing**
- **Questions to Ask**
 - Do they use all 4 years?
 - Do they only use certain classes?
 - Do they use unweighted or weighted GPA?

Deciding on a Major?

One of the first things asked on an application is your major
Students need to do your research before you start the application

- Need to know the policy of the school, do they **admit by major**? If not, how do they admit?
- A lot of specialty programs have a separate admissions process engineering, visual and performing arts, architecture and nursing
- “Undecided” is a major when applying



CSU Application Details - START

APPLICATION OCTOBER 1

- Based mainly on grades and rigor of courses
- Simple application that can be completed in one hour if you have checklist items from their website
 - no letters of recommendation, no transcripts, no SAT/ACT
- Students should have their application reviewed for accuracy before submitting



University of California System



UC Application Details

- Very competitive and complex application- should take a lot of time to complete – *No advantage to turn in early*
- Application also requires:
 - List of Activities and Awards
 - FOUR Personal Insight Questions (up to 350 words each)
 - Additional Comments
- Students should have their application reviewed before submitting
- College & Career Center Help
 - Flex Time
 - Lunch
 - Individual appointments



Comprehensive/Holistic Review

**13 academic and personal factors approved
by UC faculty (can be applicable to most
private schools)**

“ If we only looked at GPA, courses, and test scores, we would not ask for all the other information and it would be very easy to select students”

- Go to individual UC websites for great application tips and resources
 - For example, UCSB has a video series, UCs also have live webcasts

CSU/UC are competitive, make sure you turn in the best application

When Applying

- Follow all Directions

- Apply Broadly

After You Apply

- Meet all Deadlines Well in Advance

- Report All Changes

Out of State Public Colleges

Out of State Public: They are all different

Some are exclusively Common App

EX: University of Michigan and University of Colorado- Boulder

EX: University of Washington

Some exclusively use their own application

EX: Boise State

Some use multiple application platforms

Private Colleges

Private School General Info

EVERY school has its own process – need to go to its website and thoroughly understand the requirements & application

Remember the Following:

- You must work with your SHS counselor
- You must use Naviance
- Deadlines are not suggestions! (if an East Coast school remember there is a 3 hour difference)

What is the Common Application?

What are the Pieces of the Common App/ Private College Application Completed by the STUDENT

Application Requirements:

- Application
- Personal Statement/Essay (majority require)
- Required Supplemental Essays/Questions (varies by college)
- Official Test Scores if Required (sent by student)

Application for Financial Aid may require:

- CSS Profile – College Board website
- FAFSA
- Institutional FA application (Merit or Need Aid)

EVERY School has its OWN DEADLINES!

What are all the pieces of the Common Application (CA) or Private College Applications sent to the university by SEQUOIA ?

- School Report (SR)
 - Requested by student. Completed & sent by Counselor through Naviance
- Official Transcript
 - Automatically Sent by Counseling Department through Naviance
- Sequoia High School Profile
 - Sent by Counseling Department through Naviance
- Letter of Recommendations (LOR)
 - Requested by student. Completed & sent by Teachers through Naviance
- Mid Year Report (MYR)
 - Automatically completed & sent by counselor through Naviance if student requested a SSR

REALLY IMPORTANT to UNDERSTAND

School documents are sent independently of a student's application

Attend 1 mandatory meeting or flex workshop in September to receive SR/LOR form

Similar School Report & Letter of Recommendation Form (SR/LOR)

Sequoia High School: School Report (SR) & Letter of Recommendation (LOR) Request Form

Letters of recommendation are a critical component for many four-year universities. It is essential that you complete the following steps with thought, detail, and integrity. These requirements allow teachers and counselors to write the strongest letter possible on your behalf. Each action item must be completed *before* meeting with your counselor to submit this LOR request form.

Items to complete in Naviance



QR to presentation for videos

- Update your Résumé on Naviance (Click on your initials icon, then “Resume”)**
Counselors use the information from your résumé in their letter, so please provide detailed entries. You may also use your résumé for scholarships, job applications, and other opportunities.
- Upload a Personal Statement Draft (Click on your initials icon, then “Surveys”)**
Your personal statement draft essay is only viewable by counselors and will be used to gather additional information about you that may be included in their LOR. If you cover a specific topic or aspect of your life in the *draft* essay, your counselor may use this information to demonstrate your character. Your *draft* essay will only be viewed by your counselor to collect information about you. [Note: Ok to use UC Personal Insight Questions].
- Complete the Teacher LOR Survey (Click on your initials icon, then “Surveys”)**
Teacher LORs are the only place in your application where admissions will hear the perspective of a teacher that has seen you in action. Thank your recommender and be in close communication senior year.
- Counselor SR/LOR Survey on Naviance (Click on your initials icon, then “Surveys”)**
The Counselor SR/LOR Survey will help your counselor add depth and insight to the SR/LOR. It may also help you in reflecting upon your experiences/life, which can inform your personal statement/insight questions/supplements.
- Keep your “Colleges I’m applying to” list updated in Naviance (Colleges tab)**
Teachers and counselors can only send documents to schools on the list. Naviance **does not** update recommenders when you add or remove colleges, so it is up to you to communicate changes & keep your list up-to-date. *Contact your counselor if you plan to add or drop a college.*

Items to complete with the Common App

- Sign up for a Common Application Account starting 8/1/23 and link your Common Application account with Naviance. We recommend waiving your FERPA rights. If you do not waive FERPA, your teachers/counselor reserve the right to not write a LOR. Counselors will still complete the SR without the LOR.**
Linking your Common App with Naviance allows your teachers and counselor to send your SR & LOR’s to colleges.

Must have the appointment on or before;

Sept 19th for Oct 15-Dec 15 college application deadlines

Other Parts of the Process

Ethics of Completing Application

“I certify that all information submitted in the admission process—including the application, the personal essay, any supplements, and any other supporting materials —is my own work

AI - Go to the college’s website or ask admission rep

Colleges can rescind your admittance

- Schools do random checks and thorough research on applicants -
 - Ex: Stanford
- UC started checking on personal insight questions for plagiarism

Sending Transcripts

At this point, only should be for “out of state public colleges” not on Common Application

If you request them on Naviance at this time, they will be deleted

More details available our on website

Standardized Testing- Need to Check Policy for Each School

Lasting Impact of Covid 19 - Testing Requirements Have Drastically Changed and Policies are continually being updated

Terms

- **Test Optional –**
- **Test Blind -**
- **Subject Tests – College Board stopped Jan 2021**

Things to Consider

- Are you in the middle range or above for admitted students?
- How much do they weigh test scores in their decision?
- RESEARCH requirements and deadlines for each school

Sending Test Scores

- FIRST check to see if college is accepting scores this year
- THEN check to see if you can self-report on each college website (Saves Money). If they do not allow self-report, need to send score individually
- At this point, LIST but Do not submit IB Scores

Details on Handout

UNDERSTAND Sequoia does not send or report test scores for the application

It Doesn't End, After You Submit

- **Set up “portal” for each school**
 - **Check your account frequently:**
 - Colleges have technology that records when a student opens their communication systems.
- **Read and follow all directions**
- **There are consequences for any Changes on Application or Not Sending Documents**

“I didn't know” or “Nobody told me” doesn't usually work

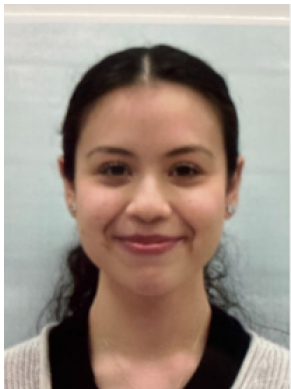

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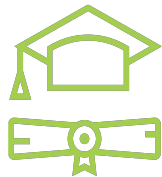

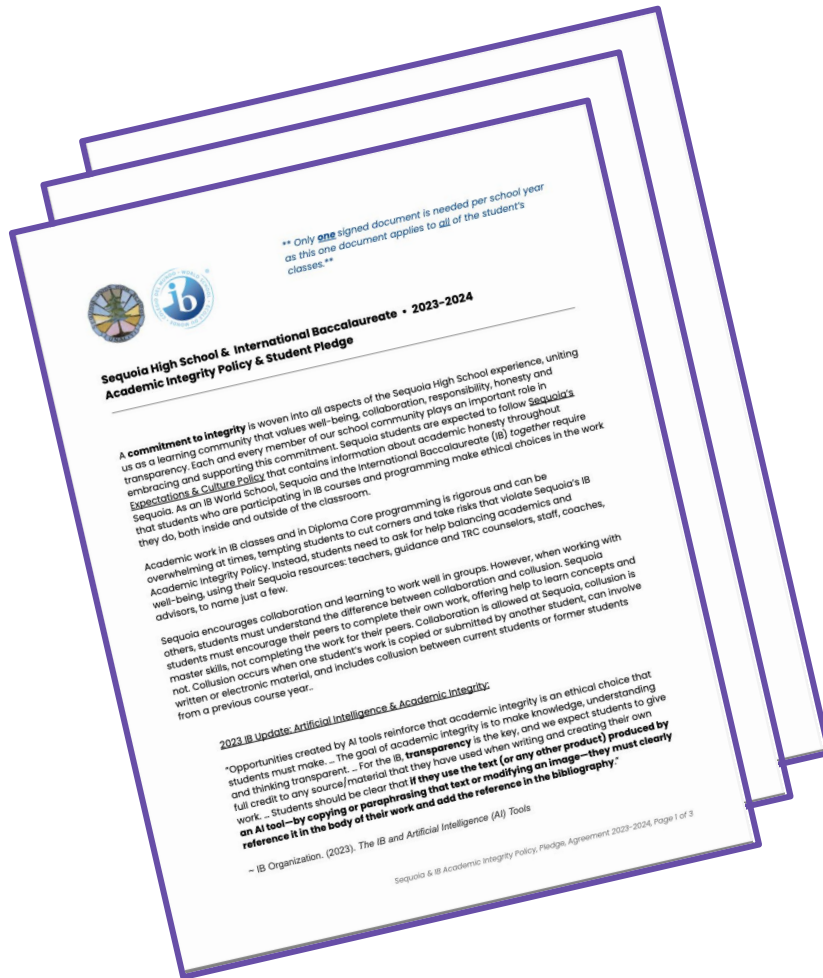

Tips to support your senior

- **Cheer for/Coach your student** from the *sidelines*.
- **Learn *together***, empathize, be real, talk about failures and fixes.
 - set aside time to **process** email regularly– to take *action*, not just *look* at it. Ideally a session on the weekend?
 - help your student learn to **manage** their email inbox so that it works for them – how to use filters, unsubscribe, change notification settings, separate email accounts.

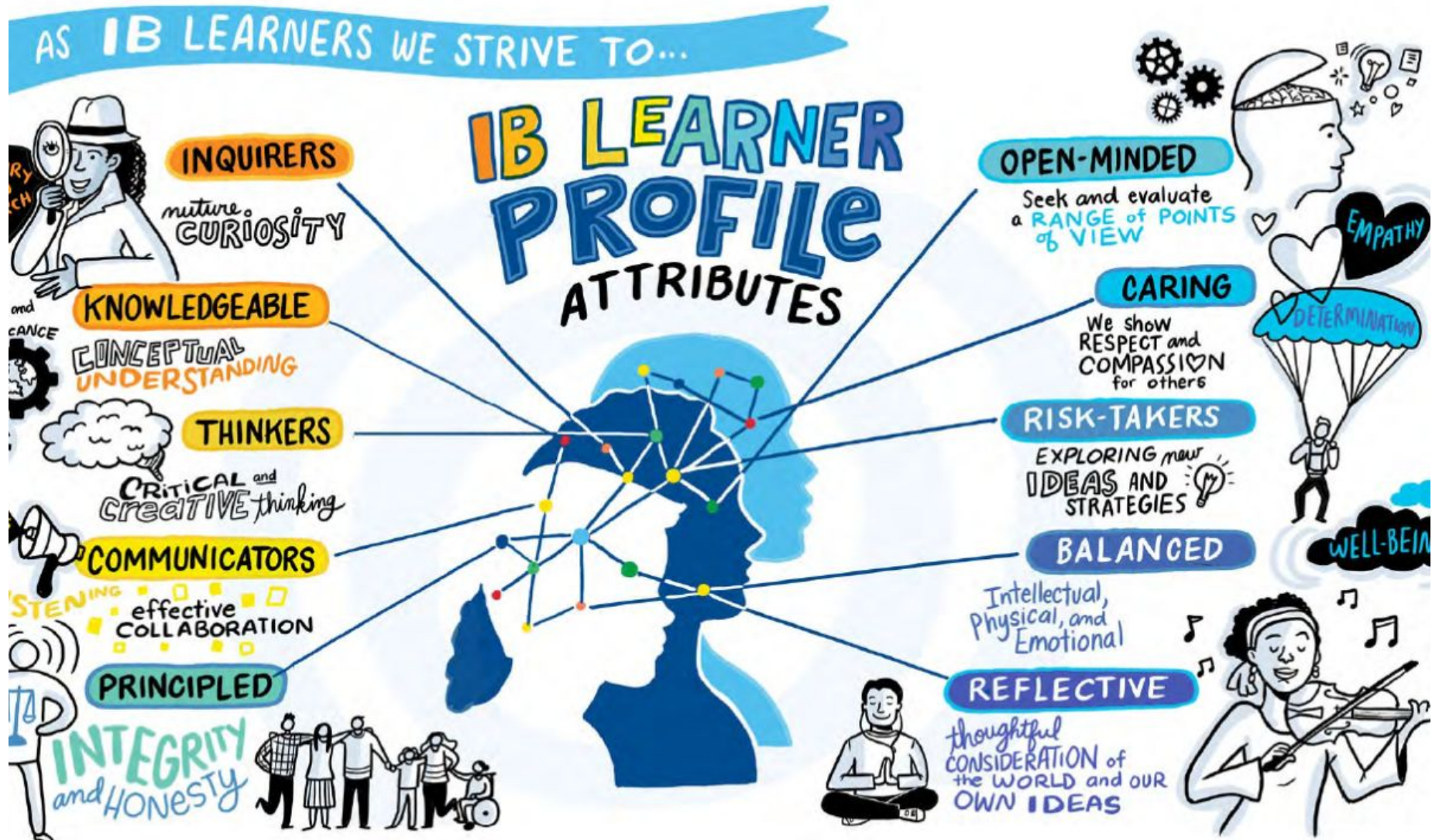
Tips to support your senior

- Help your student find a **calendar system** that works *for them*.
 - put in all commitments and appointments, add in timely reminders
 - block class time, work time for each subject, exercise, fun time, family time, chores, sleep!
 - troubleshoot, make changes
 - productivity apps like Todoist, Notion, Google Tasks can help
- Help your student think through the challenge and **find help**.
 - reach out to staff *early*– email, in person
 - book time with counselors, TRC, with IB Office
 - tutorials, flex time, tutoring, peer study groups

IB Exams & University Expectations

- IB Exams are a required component of all Sequoia IB Courses, regardless of college credit or plans.
- Colleges expect students to sit for all parts of the IB exam in the spring, putting forth best effort on all sections.
- If you put down an IB Course on your college application and indicate you are planning to take the corresponding IB exam, it adds value to your application.
- Colleges expect to receive IB scores in July for all IB exams you indicated on your application. If they do not receive an IB exam score for an exam you said you would take, they can rescind your admissions if your acceptance was conditional.

List IB exams on college apps

- List all IB exams you will be taking in Spring 2026 as a “Planned Exam”
 - Visit our IB page *Guide To Listing IB Exams on College Apps* section [HERE](#) on the school’s website to find the dates/exam names for your applications.
- List any IB exam you took in 11th grade with your earned score
 - For example: IB Physics, IB Business Management, IB Psychology, IB Chemistry
- Adds value to your college application

College Credit

- **Colleges** decide their policy for score requirements, credits granted, level changes.
- An exam score of 4 or higher *may* receive college credit (just like a score of 3 or higher on an AP exam), **depending on the college, the department, and the major.**
- Policy **varies by university**, and even varies within a **college** system (eg. each UC may vary) and by **major.**
- Check each specific university.

Advanced Placement (AP): **Caution**

Sequoia High School does not administer AP Exams.

If a student is self-studying for AP, they need to find their own location to take those tests.

The College and Career Center does not recommend self-studying and taking AP tests for subjects offered at Sequoia in IB, at any level of IB. For students who are applying to international programs, they should consult with the College and Career Center immediately.

Advanced Placement (AP): **Caution**

We are aware that in the community, people are giving advice that you must take AP tests to be competitive in college admissions. **This is contrary to all conversations with college admissions representatives.**

Colleges are evaluating you based on the context of the school you go to.

“But someone told me an AP score at the end of junior year helps me with showing my skills/talents?” If your IB course is a two year course, colleges are looking at your course schedule and grades you receive. They are not looking for an AP or IB exam score at the end of junior year. Better to spend your energy doing a GREAT job in your IB course.

Predicted Grades (PGs) for University



What are “PG”s?

- “A predicted grade is the teacher’s estimation of the grade the candidate is expected to achieve in the subject. A predicted grade should be based on:
 - all the evidence of the candidate’s work
 - the teacher’s knowledge of IB standards.”

~ Diploma Program Assessment Procedures Section C3.2.2

- Teachers use IB grade descriptors to help guide the PG process.

Outside of the US

- Many international universities require PGs for admissions.
- Sequoia provides **international** institutions with PGs to allow Sequoia students to study abroad.
- Institutions in some countries require **specific IB scores** for admissions or even **specific IB courses** and **specific HL or SL levels**. Admission can be conditional on actually earning the required scores.
- Students are responsible for researching institution requirements and alerting the IB Office of application needs.

Predicted Grade Requests

If applying to **international** institutions, students must research requirements and identify if PGs are required. If yes, proceed with these next steps:

1. Contact the institution informing them that Sequoia policy prohibits sharing PGs with students. How can IB Coordinator submit your PGs to university on your behalf?
2. Complete [this Predicted Grade Request Form](#) for every **international** institution requiring PGs.
3. Submit form **at least 3 weeks ahead** of the institution's submission deadline. Requests made less than 3 weeks before deadline are not guaranteed to be submitted on time.
4. Be sure to continue to monitor your school email in case Ms. Niño needs to email you with questions in order to submit your PGs.

Inside the US

- **No institutions in the US require PGs** in order for applicants to be reviewed and admitted.
- Students are not punished or disadvantaged in the college review process if they do not submit PGs.
- As a large public high school, Sequoia does not provide PGs for domestic institutions.
- Some institutions give students a choice to use their IB PGs as an option for the standardized test requirement. This does NOT mean IB PGs are *required*. Students must select a different option from the standardized tests list to submit for this requirement.
- US institutions read our [School Profile](#) and know we don't provide PGs to US colleges and universities.

NYU has one of the most flexible testing policies of any college or university, including an extension of our test-optional policy in the 2021-2022 cycle in response to the COVID19 pandemic. Students who elect to submit testing as part of their application for Fall 2022 admission should submit one of the following:

- [SAT](#); or
- [ACT](#); or
- [International Baccalaureate \(IB\) Diploma](#); or
- [Three \(3\) SAT Subject Test scores](#); or
- [Three \(3\) AP Exam scores](#); or
- [Three \(3\) IB higher-level exam scores](#) if not an IB Diploma candidate; or
- [Other international examinations](#) that show you completed, or if submitting predicted results show you will complete, your secondary education. You can use our [International Qualifications Tool](#) for information about credentials we accept from the country in which you are enrolled in secondary school
- Applicants to programs in our Steinhardt School of Culture, Education, and Human Development and our Tisch School of the Arts requiring an [audition or portfolio](#) are **not** required to submit [standardized testing](#) for consideration and doing so is entirely optional. For other programs where an audition or portfolio is optional but not required, testing is required.

All applicants to our campus in New York must meet our [English language requirements](#).

Students have a choice as to what standardized test score is submitted. IB predicted grades are not an option at Sequoia High School for national institutions.

IB & Assessment



What's in an IB Score?

Your final IB score is made up of:

1. Internal Assessments (IAs)

- Formal IB Assessments
- IAs are carried out by the IB Teacher throughout the entire course (1 or 2 years)
- IA assignments vary by course
- Example: IB English IAs = Individual Oral, HL Essay

2. Spring “May” Exams

- Exams vary by course
- Example: HL Eng= Paper 1 & 2 vs. HL History= Paper 1, 2 & 3

IA Late Work Policy

- IAs are due when they are due. **No exceptions.**
- IAs include oral assessments.
- If any IA is not turned in on the due date, it cannot be submitted to the IB organization. Students will have an incomplete assessment (N grade) for that subject area.
- Students who receive extended time on assessments through a 504 or IEP will receive (if needed) 72 additional hours to turn in an official IA without penalty.
 - The 72 hours starts at the time the IA was due and includes non-school days. For example: IA due Friday 2nd period (8:30 AM) so IA is due following Monday at 8:30 AM.

IB Spring Exams

- The IB experience includes completing IB coursework, submitting IAs and sitting for spring exams.
- IB Exams will take place at Sequoia, in person, weekdays from **April 28th through May 20th, 2026.**
 - There are no make up exam dates.
 - Do not schedule travel, sports, religious or family events during these weekdays.
 - Stay healthy. We will help you if you feel unwell.

IB Exam Scores

- IB scores on a scale of 1 – 7
- 4–7 = passing scores
- N score= A student is missing an exam component (from May or from IA). Non passing.
- Exam results released to students in early July.
- For those headed to college, exam scores released to colleges electronically mid-July.
- Diplomas and certificates are available in IB Office at the end of August, beginning of September.

IB Registration Process

- Deadline to register is November 1, 2025.
- Any changes to IB registration due by November 1st
 - Contact the IB Office with changes.
- IB exam letters with exact fees/invoice will be mailed in September and October
- IB does not offer any make-up or alternate exam dates.
- Remember, November 1st is an important deadline. After that date, students enrolled in IB course in a testing year will remain in that course till the end of the school year.

IB Exam Accommodations

IAs

- 504/IEP students can access 72-hour extension on IAs.
 - The 72-hour extension starts at the time the IA was due and includes non-school days. (eg. IA due Friday 2nd period which starts at 8:30 AM so IA is due Monday at 8:30 AM.)
- Students with IEP/504s are encouraged to meet with their teachers at the time the IA is *assigned* to map out their IA plan to reduce stress.

IB Exam Accommodations

Spring IB Exams

- Students must apply for exam accommodations through the IB Office.
- Students are not guaranteed the same accommodations they receive in their Sequoia 504/IEP.
- Testing accommodation decisions are made by the IB organization.

Applying for IB Exam Accommodations

Per IB Policy, the following items are due to the IB Office no later than Oct 15th:

1. A psychological/psycho-educational/medical report is required from a licensed professional including the diagnosis and test/techniques used.
2. Educational evidence (504 or IEP in place prior).
3. IB Application for Special Needs Assessment Form completed by licensed professional.

IB Diploma Student: What do I need?



Diploma Award Requirements

Reasons a student would not be awarded the Diploma:

1. CAS requirements have not been met.
2. Candidate's total points are fewer than 24.
3. An N has been given for theory of knowledge, extended essay or for a contributing subject.
4. A grade E has been awarded for one or both of theory of knowledge and the extended essay.
5. There is a grade 1 awarded in a subject/level.

Diploma Award Requirements

Reasons a student would not be awarded Diploma (continued):

6. Grade 2 has been awarded three or more times (HL or SL).
7. Grade 3 or below has been awarded four or more times (HL or SL).
8. Candidate has gained fewer than 12 points on HL subjects (for candidates who register for four HL subjects, the three highest grades count).
9. Candidate has gained fewer than 9 points on SL subjects (candidates who register for two SL subjects must gain at least 5 points at SL).

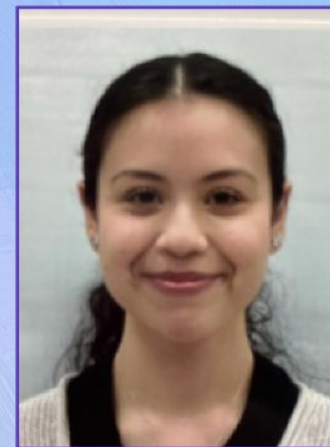
