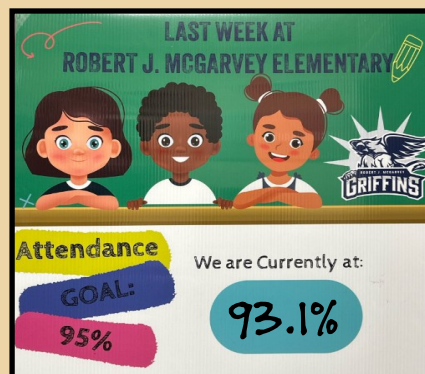

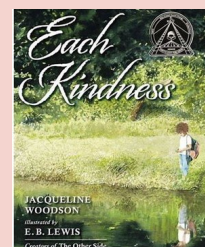

Benefits of Preventing Wasted Food at Home

Preventing food waste at home helps you save money by buying only what you need, eating what you purchase, and keeping perfectly good food out of the trash—something a family of four could benefit from by saving up to \$56 each week. It also reduces your environmental footprint by conserving the water, energy, and resources used to produce and transport food. Small changes in how you shop, store, and cook can make a meaningful impact for your household and the planet.



Planning and Shopping Tips

Planning meals before you shop helps save time, money, and reduces waste. Buy only what you expect to use and focus on foods your household already enjoys.

- Keep a list of favorite meals and ingredients to simplify planning and shopping.
- Check your fridge, freezer, and pantry first and plan meals around what needs to be used.
- Make a weekly meal plan and purchase only what's needed for those meals.
- Base your shopping list on how many meals you'll eat at home, factoring in dining out, frozen meals, and leftovers.
- Add quantities to your list to avoid overbuying (e.g., "salad greens—enough for two lunches").
- Bulk deals only save money if you use the food before it spoils.
- Buying from bulk bins can reduce cost and waste—store items properly in airtight, labeled containers.
- Consider imperfect produce or upcycled products, which are nutritious, safe, and often discounted.

Cooking and Preparation Tips

- Produce that's past its prime and leftover bits can often still be used—try adding them to soups, casseroles, stir-fries, frittatas, sauces, baked goods, pancakes, or smoothies to reduce waste.
- Use edible food parts you might normally discard—stale bread for croutons, beet greens as a sautéed side, or vegetable scraps for homemade stock.
- Learn the differences between "sell by," "use by," "best by," and expiration dates.
- Cook and serve appropriate portions for the number of people eating.
- Preserve extra produce by freezing, pickling, dehydrating, canning, or making jams.
- Don't leave perishable food out for more than two hours.
- Store leftovers in clear, labeled containers with dates and refrigerate or freeze promptly.

Protect Your Eye Health

- **Rest your eyes.** Take a break from tasks that require focusing on nearby objects every 20 minutes, and look at something about 20 feet away for 20 seconds.
- **Limit screen time and take breaks often.** Encourage kids to spend more time outdoors and focus on things in the distance.
- **Keep your eyes moist.** Use eye drops called artificial tears when your eyes feel dry.
- **Prevent the air in your home from getting too dry.** Use a humidifier. Limit air conditioning.
- **Wear sunglasses when outside.** Choose sunglasses that block 99 to 100 percent of both UVA and UVB radiation.
- **Keep your eyeglasses and/or contacts prescription current.** Learn how to properly care for your contacts.
- **Maintain a healthy lifestyle.** Drink plenty of water, eat healthy, and get enough physical activity. Healthy habits can lower your risk for diseases and conditions that lead to eye or vision problems.
- **Quit smoking and keep your home smoke-free.** Get free help at smokefree.gov, 1-800-QUIT-NOW (1-800-784-8669), or by texting QUIT to 47848.

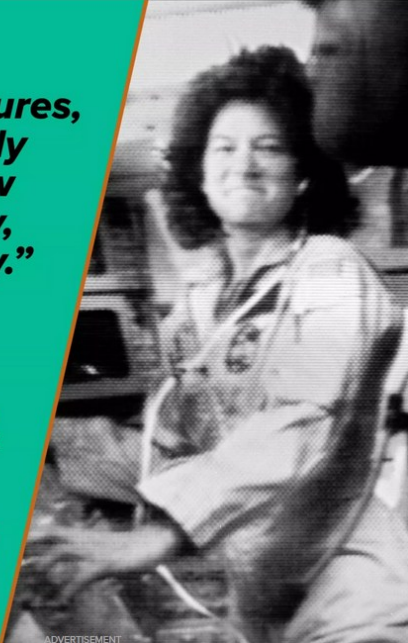

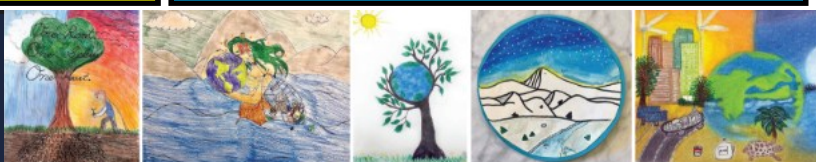

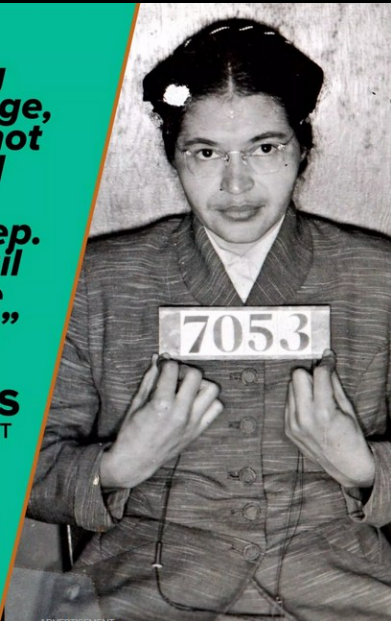

Starting this week, EGUSD and local law enforcement will begin a coordinated two-pronged initiative aimed at reducing e-bike and scooter collisions and preventing serious injuries. The first phase will consist of a 30-day education campaign across various platforms. The enforcement phase will follow. Officers will conduct zero-tolerance enforcement in and around school areas and will take enforcement action when illegal or unsafe operation of e-bikes or scooters is observed. Please review these flyers and make sure your family is complying with these important safety laws.

Other Info	No minimum age requirement to ride
POSSIBLE PENALTIES	
1. Helmet Citation, if applicable	
2. Right of way citation, if ridden improperly.	

California Vehicle Code

- A low-speed pedal-assisted electric bicycle equipped with a speedometer, and a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and ceases to assist when a speed of 28 mph is reached

Helmet	Bicycle helmet required regardless of age CVC 21213(a)
