After School / Enrichment

- Continued implementation support for ELOP programming with a focus on high-quality enrichment and student engagement aligned to instructional priorities.
- Staff capacity building included participation in county training on **embedding SEL practices into Expanded Learning** to increase student belonging, engagement, and readiness to learn.

Intersession / Camps

 Supported planning and coordination for intersession enrichment opportunities (TK-8), including balanced offerings that promote physical wellness, creativity, and student voice. October Camps were very successful regardless of the Rain and many are looking forward to our 2 day Crafting Intersession on December 22 & 23.

Independent Study (LTIS)

- Ongoing monitoring and coordination of long-term independent study (LTIS) to ensure continuity of learning and compliance:
 - Still looking for more Electives for the LTIS students we are quite limited in our offerings for our WHS students as the elective requirement is high.
 - At the time of this report we are currently at 22 students from K-12 grade.

Career Technical Education (CTE)

State & Regional Alignment

 Participated in the CDE CTE Directors Quarterly Meeting to align local pathway development with statewide expectations for quality, metrics, and program improvement.

- Attended training put on by CDE on **CTE Advisory Committees (How & Why)** to strengthen industry engagement, pathway relevance, and accountability structures.
- As Chris may have mentioned we held our first WUSD CTE advisory committee, it was well attended and we received good feedback from our community members.
- Alyssa Schager and I are taking a team of CTE teachers to the ACTE/NAAE conference in Nashville next week. To learn more about what we can do to build and improve upon the pathways that we have in Willows and Glenn County.
- On December 2nd, Willows High School hosted a county wide CTE advisory meeting to showcase our pathways here in WUSD.

- Met with regional leads to coordinate shared strategies around:

 - o work-based learning alignment,
 - o and data-driven continuous improvement for student outcomes.
