All clarifications, updates and questions received are posted below with corresponding answers.

Q1: I saw that the Frozen, Refrigerated, and Dry Goods bid was posted. Please let me know when the Ice Cream Bid will be released.

**A: The District will not be releasing a Bid for Ice Cream.**

Q2: My company would like to put in a bid for frozen goods on the RFP2526-10 (CNS) I noticed at the top of the bid sheet that you have to bid on at least 107 items on the list. I feel being a small business you are eliminating my business from bidding making this bid not open to small businesses we do not process meats, and alot of frozen products but, I do process alot of bakery products but, will not be 107 items I feel that is discriminating against the small business and only making this bid for large bidders. Please explain if the frozen bid will be allowed fair opportunity to all businesses?

**A: The District appreciates your interest in RFP 2526-10 and your comments regarding the minimum item requirement for Category I.**

**As set forth in the solicitation, this RFP was structured to meet the operational requirements of the District's Child Nutrition Services program. The RFP establishes two separate categories and provides that bidders must bid on at least 85% of the products in each category. For Category I, Exhibit A further specifies that proposers must submit pricing for at least 107 of the 125 listed items. These requirements were established to support the District's need for reliable product coverage, continuity of supply, and efficient contract administration for the product categories being solicited.**

**The minimum item threshold was not adopted for the purpose of excluding any particular class of vendor, including small businesses. Rather, it is a solicitation requirement that applies uniformly to all proposers and reflects the District's determination of its operational needs for this procurement. The RFP also expressly reserves to the District the right to award one or more contracts by category, as determined to be in the District's best interest.**

**Accordingly, all firms are afforded the same opportunity to compete, provided they are able to submit a responsive proposal meeting the requirements of the solicitation as issued. Any interpretation, modification, or change to the solicitation requirements must be made through the written question-and-addendum process described in the RFP.**
