Graduation Requirements (Policy 6146.1)

Subject	EGUSD/Monterey Trail Requirements
<i>English</i>	<i>40 Credits</i>
<i>Mathematics & Science</i>	<i>40 Credits of Math to include Math 1 AND 20 Credits of Science to include Physical and Life Science OR 30 Credits of Math to include Math 1 AND 30 Credits of Science to include Physical and Life Science</i>
<i>Social Science</i>	<i>35 Credits: including Ethnic Studies; United States History; World History; American Government, & Economics.</i>
<i>Physical Ed</i>	<i>20 Credits</i>
<i>World Language & VAPA</i>	<i>10 credits of World Language and 10 credits of Visual & Performing Arts; OR 20 credits of the same World Language</i>
<i>Health</i>	<i>5 Credits</i>
<i>Technology</i>	<i>5 Credits or Proficiency Test</i>
<i>Elective Credits</i>	<i>35 Credits</i>
<i>Total Credits Req</i>	<i><u>220</u></i>

BOARD POLICY (Policy 6146.1)



Validating Experience

- *EGUSD believes it is important for students to validate their educational experience and demonstrate College and Career Readiness. In order for students to demonstrate College and Career Readiness, and graduate from EGUSD, students must pass ten (10) credits in one (1) of the following in their Senior Year:*
 - *AP/IB Course;*
 - *JROTC Senior Course;*
 - *AVID Senior Seminar;*
 - *Math Course; or*
 - *Career Technical Education (CTE) Capstone Course;*
- *Alternatively, seniors may also demonstrate College and Career Readiness and graduate by the following:*
 - *Meeting UC/CSU A-G requirements; or*
 - *Earning a Seal of Biliteracy.*

BOARD POLICY (Regulation Policy 5127)



Achievement

- To participate in the high school graduation ceremony, a student must earn 35 out of 40 credits in the 3rd and 4th terms at block-schedule high schools.
- Seniors must pass 12th grade English, Government, Economics, and complete a Validating Experience.



Unpaid Damages

- In cases where a senior student has willfully damaged, or otherwise injured the property of the District, or failed to return the property of the District that has been loaned to the student, that student may be denied the privilege of participating in the graduation ceremony until the student or student's parent or guardian has paid for the damage or replacement costs of the District's personal property.

BOARD POLICY (Regulation Policy 5127)



Good Citizenship/Discipline

- A senior student who receives an off-campus suspension from school in the second semester or 3rd and 4th terms of the school year will be notified in writing that if a second off-campus suspendable offense occurs, he/she may not be allowed to participate in the graduation ceremony.
- Any senior student who receives an off-campus suspension within the last 20 school attendance days prior to the date of graduation may be denied the privilege of participating in the graduation ceremony, even if that off-campus suspension is the student's first off-campus suspension during his/her senior year.
- If a student receives an off-campus suspension that falls on the day of graduation practice or of the graduation ceremony, that student will not be allowed to participate in graduation.

SOBER GRAD NIGHT

**Sober Grad Night Committee*

- 
- **Sober Grad Night** is an elaborate all-night party of thrown each year on the night of graduation exclusively for the graduating class.
 - This evening of fun is put on solely by volunteer parents, CHP officers and community members

Why is Sober Grad night so important?

- ! 9% of high school students reported binge drinking during the past month.
 - More high school girls drink alcohol and binge drink, compared to high school boys.
- ! About 16% of high school students reported riding in the past month with a driver who had been drinking alcohol.
- ! About 5% of high school students who had driven in the past month said they drove after drinking alcohol.

*Data from CDC Website- Underage Drinking

- ! 66.5% of 12th graders don't think it's very risky to try a prescription narcotic other than heroin (codeine, Vicodin, OxyContin, Percocet) once or twice.
- ! 26% of 12th graders have used illicit drugs in the last year.
- ! Underage drinking contributes to the 3 leading causes of death among persons aged 12 to 20 years
 - (unintentional injury, homicide, and suicide).
- ! Marijuana today is much stronger than it used to be.
 - In 1995, it had about 3% THC (the chemical that causes a high), but by 2021, that number jumped to 15%. This higher potency increases the risk of serious mental health issues for teens, including psychosis and severe mental illness.
