2. Instructional Use of AI, Maria Garcia-Rios, Assistant Director Technology Services
 - a. NEISD aims for AI usage that promotes balance, human connection, intention, reflection, transparency, best practices
 - b. NEISD has worked diligently to protect student data in the use of AI
 - c. Playbooks for AI Usage for Educators and Administrators
 - d. Not all AI is open to use by NEISD students and is limited by digital privacy agreements
 - e. AI literacy is an ongoing conversation
 - f. The department encourages open dialogue between stakeholders.

Choosing The Best Implementation

Notable Points:

- **SY 23-24** - Staggered implementation and did not include 8th grade
- **SY 24-25** - 7th/8th combined lessons, potential repeat lessons for 8th graders
- **SY 25-26** - First year of 4 programs (6th, 7th, 8th, HS)
- **SY 26-27** - Final year of our original 4 year adoption agreement

Data trends with previous programs (*Returned - 84% of which 96% Opt-In*) but cannot be compared apples to apples, due to differences in previous opt-in options for parents.

School Year 2026-2027 CHASE will present recommendation for future continuation of the program.
