Meeting Called to Order at 12:15 PM

Kelly Lepeska, SHAC Co-Chair, called the meeting to order.

Approval of February 22 Minutes

Debbie Freno made a motion to approve the February 22, 2022 minutes. Rachel Brodine seconded the motion which was approved after a voice vote was taken. Later, it was noted that Deb Caldwell was not listed as an attendee on the minutes, so Debbie Freno made a motion to amend the minutes to reflect Deb Caldwell as an attendee. The motion was seconded by Meghan Roberts and approved after a voice vote was taken.

Recommendation for April 19 Subcommittee Meeting

Jennifer Aguilar, Director of Physical Education and Health, recommended the April 19 Subcommittee Meeting be changed to a full SHAC Meeting to allow Alex Vardell to review the School Health Index (SHI) information since he would not be able to do so as originally planned at this meeting due to the need to finish the Instructional Materials Adoption recommendation. Debbie Freno made a motion to change the April 19 subcommittee meeting to a full SHAC Meeting. Rachel Brodine seconded the motion which was approved after a voice vote was taken.

PE & Health Instructional Materials Teacher Results and Recommendation

Katie Steinhoff, Instructional Specialist for Health, reviewed the resources that were provided to the members in their packets including the teacher voting outcomes, rubric evaluations, Publisher Q and A responses with photocopies of instructional materials referenced in the specific Q & A questions and publisher answers, new PE and Health TEKS, and parent/community emails to SHAC providing feedback on the instructional materials for High School PE, High School Health, and Middle School Health. Ms. Steinhoff pointed out that two new emails were included in the packet and those were found at the back of the packet of emails.

After reviewing the Middle School (6th grade) Health instructional materials feedback / responses, time was provided for all members to review the information presented and the floor was opened for questions and comments. Jennifer Aguilar, Director for Physical Education and Health and Katie Steinhoff, Instructional Specialist for Health, answered questions. Once no more questions or comments on the Middle School (6th grade) Health Instructional Materials were posed, Sean Metcalf, SHAC Co-Chair, facilitated the council in submitting their recommendation using a paper ballot. Although votes were not counted during the meeting, the result of the vote was a recommendation for Goodheart-Wilcox (16 votes for Goodheart-Wilcox, 3 votes for McGraw Hill, 1 vote for none, and 11 members abstained from voting).

After reviewing the Elementary PE and Health instructional materials feedback / responses, time was provided for all members to review the information presented and the floor was opened for questions and comments. Jennifer Aguilar, Director of Physical Education; Katie Steinhoff, Instructional Specialist for Health; and Brandon Turner, Instructional Specialist for PE answered questions. Due to time constraints, paper ballots were handed out during questioning for those members who might need to leave prior to all questions being addressed but felt ready to vote. Members were reminded that they could abstain from voting if they did not feel they had enough information. Once no more questions or comments were posed on the Elementary PE and Health instructional materials, Sean Metcalf, SHAC Co-Chair, facilitated the council in submitting their recommendation using the paper ballot. Although votes were not counted during the meeting, the result of the vote was a recommendation for QuaverEd (19 votes for QuaverEd, 3 votes for none, and 9 members abstained from voting)
