Dear Parent or Guardian:

We are pleased to inform you that **McCloud Elementary School** will continue to offer the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) available to schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs for the **2025-2026** School Year.

Schools that participate in the CEP are able to provide healthy breakfasts **and** lunches each day at no charge for **all** students enrolled in that CEP school during the **2025-2026** School Year.

In California, NSLP applications are also used to identify students as low-income, referred to as "Free or Reduced-Price Meal (FRPM) eligible," so that they may be included in LEAs' Unduplicated Pupil Count (UPC) used to determine supplemental and concentration grants under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). LEAs certify these data as part of the Fall 1 submission to the California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System (CALPADS).

We are providing a **Household Income Data Collection Form** so that we can continue to identify low-income students for our UPC, LCFF and CALPADS reporting requirements. Please look over the income guidelines and if you qualify, please return the form to the school.
