Nearly 4,000 12th grade students will graduate under the Distinguished Level of Achievement: To graduate with DLOA, students are required to earn 26 credits to include Algebra II and they must also earn at least 1 endorsement. An endorsement can be earned in Multidisciplinary Studies, STEM, Business and Industry, Public Service or Arts and Humanities.

2022 Special Education students who earned their CCMR indicator: 79%; Highest in the region and on track to surpass that goal for 2023 grads.
