Nevada City, CA – The Nevada County Transportation Commission and the City of Nevada City invite community members to attend the final public workshop for the Zion–Sacramento Pedestrian and Bicycle Mobility Plan on Thursday, April 2, 2026, from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the Miners Foundry (325 Spring Street, Nevada City).
