If you're the parents or guardians of one of the 52 Twin Rivers students who were awarded scholarships and received on-the-spot college acceptances at this year's Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Recruitment Fair—congratulations! You must be bursting with pride, and we are right there with you. Imagine the excitement your student felt walking away with both a scholarship and a college acceptance in hand. Moments like this are exactly why we do what we do: open doors, create opportunities, and help every student step confidently into their future.

The students represent four of our high schools—Foothill, Grant, Highlands, and Rio Linda—and reflect the talent, perseverance, and potential across our district. Together, they earned scholarships totaling \$711,984 per year, amounting to \$2,847,936 over four years.
