Grades 5-8 Parent Perception Survey Results

Thank you, parents, for filling out the survey. We had 461 families (or 37% of families) in grades 5-8 respond. Based on these responses, I proudly present the following data.

- 95% of respondents give a grade of A or B to their school
- 94% Strongly Agree or Agree (SA or A) that the school promotes academic success
- 96% SA or A that their student is treated with respect
- 89% SA or A that the school keeps them well informed regarding their child's progress
- 94% SA or A that the school is a welcoming place
- 95% SA or A that the school is a safe place
- 88% SA or A with the effort to teach social-emotional skills
- 85% SA or A that the school encourages them to be an active partner
- 94% SA or A that adults care about their child
- 91% SA or A that the school clearly teaches behavior expectations
- 15% SA or A that their child has experienced bullying (25%, 27%, and 34% over the past three years)
- 2% SA or A that their child has experienced racial/ethnic conflict in school (9%, 6%, and 8% last three years)
