Take Off, Chico! returned for its third year on October 18th, bringing the community together for a day of excitement at the Chico Regional Airport. The Tuskegee Airmen displayed authentic WWII artifacts preserved by their chapter, while the Chico Air showcased historic aircraft, uniforms, and other unique exhibits for guests to enjoy. Emergency service crews displayed their ground and air response units, brought swag, and gave the community an exciting and up-close look at some of their operating equipment. Aero-Flite Aerial Firefighting and CAL FIRE brought their fire-response aircraft, allowing attendees to tour them and learn about their importance in firefighting.
