## IEP Training

## 504 Training

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act is a civil rights law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability. In other words, if your child needs help in school then a 504 plan may be exactly the thing to get him on track! Many students have conditions or disorders that are not readily apparent to others. We’ll tell you what you need to know about Section 504 and how you can use it as a tool for assisting your child’s education.


## Who is Rowell Family Empowerment?

A child/individual may have a diagnosis, may be at risk, or the parents may be concerned and would like to seek an evaluation. Whatever the reason, we provide guidance to families who may not be familiar with the special education system, community navigation or related services. We do this through providing support, training, and parent consultation services such as:

- Free Trainings (504, IFSP to IEP, Behavior Interventions, IEP, Transition planning etc.)
- In-person and phone consultation about your child’s education needs and other related services
- Regional Center Funded Programs (Respite, Personal Assistance, S.L.A.T.E.)
- Behavior Support Services (ABA Therapy) Community Navigation (IHSS, SSI, Medicaid/Medi-cal, etc.)
