**Community:** The district covers 320 square miles. It has 68 schools within the City of Elk Grove, the City of Sacramento, the City of Rancho Cordova and the unincorporated area of Sacramento County. The district serves more than 62,000 students. Of those, more than 10,000 speak more than one language.

**School:** Franklin High School is one of nine comprehensive public high schools in the Elk Grove Unified School District, enrolling 2,740 students in grades 9-12. The school opened in the fall of 2002 and graduated its first senior class in the spring of 2005. Franklin High School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

### Schedule

4x4 Copernican Block Schedule

- Four nine-week terms, four 90-minute classes per term (with a few exceptions)
- Traditional year-long, two semester classes taught in two alternating terms
- One-half year credit for each core academic course per nine-week term
- Students in grades 9 and 10 receive extended instruction in English, Mathematics 1 and Mathematics 2
