New Business (45 min.) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Review the 25-26 SPSA ● Monitor and Review school plan implementation (using SPSA monitoring tool) ● Complete the comprehensive needs assessment ● Recommendations for 26-27 SPSA 	N/A	Chair/Principal	<p>SPSA: page 54 lists all budgets requiring approval. Prop 28 adds Arts and Music funding described as federal and intended to expand school arts/music programs. 80% of prop 28 funds must be allocated to staffing. Site discretionary funds are the least restrictive and allow flexible spending. Certain VAPA sections have smaller allocations but will continue due to additional funding beyond site allocation.</p> <p>Funding Total and Changes: supplemental and concentration funds are currently about \$70,000 each. Title I funds are most restrictive and target unduplicated students such as English learners, special education, foster, and homeless while serving all students. Next year supplemental and concentration budgets are reduced by about 25%, decreasing to about \$54,000 each. Title I funding increases by about \$45,000 for next year. Goal monitoring shows. Puente overnight field trips are encumbered: concentration funds will be sent soon: credit recovery savings funded bussing and afterschool interventions, tutors are funded via supplemental, site assets and work study.</p> <p>Current Allocations: supplemental \$52,600, concentration \$52,600, discretionary \$50,400, Title I is listed as \$207,930</p> <p>EL Goal 3 hires bilingual tutors to provide multilingual support for the school day and Saturday school under Title 1 funding. Goal 4 funds student leadership opportunities, additional link crew funding and opportunity to expand on campus leadership opportunities.</p> <p>parent support allocations remain unspent: funds could cover sending a parent to CABE conference.</p>
