Hello GIS Families!



Parental Input Needed on Book Selections!



At Gateway International School, we deeply respect the diverse values and beliefs that make up our community. With this in mind, we want to share some important information regarding our library collection. We recognize that each family has its own preferences about what their children are allowed to read. Mrs. K, who supports our library, helps manage a wide range of books, some of which may cover topics that certain families might find sensitive or not suitable for their children.

Some books in our collection are not approved by all families. Three of the most requested titles—*Harry Potter*, *Goosebumps* (for PYP and MYP students), and *Long Way Down* (only for MYP students)—fall into this category. For this reason, we are asking all parents to complete a permission form indicating whether or not they allow their child to check out these specific books. **We will require a signed permission slip for students to check out these specific titles.**

This form will be sent home with your child after the break, and all parents must complete it, <u>regardless of approval</u>.

Copies will also be available at the front office upon request.

Reminder: Please Return Overdue Library Books

When your child checks out a book(s) from the GIS Library/Inquiry Center, they need to remember to return them after they're done reading. Please help us by looking around your house or in your car for the book(s) that belong to our school. If you cannot find any missing book(s), you will have two choices: buy a new one that resembles the missing one, or pay the replacement cost for the missing book(s). That way, we can keep our library open for other students to use.
