- **Fever:** If your child has a fever they are required to stay home until they are fever free for at least 24 hours without fever reducing medication (tylenol, motrin, etc).
- **Vomiting and/or Diarrhea:** Please keep your student home until they have at least one full day of normal health (no vomiting and/or diarrhea).
- **For Colds and Flu's:** If your child must be fever free for at least 24 hours (without fever reducing medications) and the cold/flu symptoms must be resolved or improving to return to school.

They come in a variety of sizes and colors, including orange, white and purple. Sweet potatoes are high in fiber which helps digestion and gut health. They contain vitamins A, B, C and E and minerals copper, potassium and manganese which help support vision and immunity.</p> <p>The sweet potatoes are being purchased from We Grow Farms. It is grown and harvested locally in West Sacramento. They are a community farm that plays an active role in the local food system as they regenerate the land they cultivate. We remain committed to supporting local farmers and serving California grown produce whenever possible.</p>

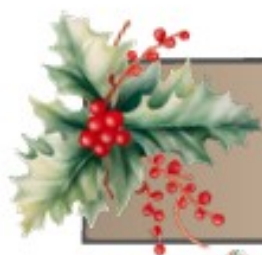
