Project HIGHER is an innovative program that assists individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (ages 18-25) in El Paso County to complete a level-one certificate at EPCC and find employment in their area of study. Project HIGHER is a unique supported educational model based upon supported employment models to help participants succeed in post-secondary education and ultimately achieve employment. The program utilizes an Educational Coach who works one-on-one with the student in and out of the classroom and gradually reduces the time spent with the student as he/she becomes better adjusted and more independent.

Lone Star College lifePATH® is a four-year comprehensive model of post-secondary educational opportunities for students who have disabilities that affect executive functioning. lifePATH focuses on academic readiness, social expectations, and career exploration. Students are selected as a cohort, taking classes together on the foundation path. After two years, students may exit the cohort and pursue other certificate or degree programs at LSC with wrap-around supports. Students remaining in the cohort will spend the last two years earning the Occupational and Life Skills Associate degree (OLSA) and the Business Operations Certificate. The OLSA degree addresses executive functioning challenges experienced by people with neurodevelopmental disabilities. Degree requirements provide opportunities for direct instruction in the academic, workforce, intrapersonal, and interpersonal behavioral expectations necessary for success in the college classroom, workforce, and personal interactions.

The CASE program assists students with Autism and other developmental disabilities to navigate college and empower them to reach their postsecondary academic goals and to find competitive employment after graduation. The CASE program offers an innovative college support program for students, diagnosed with Autism and other developmental disabilities pursuing an academic degree at Texas Tech University or South Plains College in West Texas. With the support of the Burkhardt Center for Autism Education and Research, the CASE program provides research-based, customized supports for students to facilitate their successful transition to college and the entrance into competitive employment after graduation. Each student in CASE works with a Learning Specialist who assists and guides the student through his or her academic career. Learning Specialists create personalized plans to identify each student's needs and build skills for independent living, social connections, and employment.

E4Texas is for people who are 18 years and older and have graduated from high school, or have a GED, and want to be a Personal Care Attendant. The E4Texas experience combines classroom instruction with practical career building experiences in addition to independent living skills and self-determination. Students will obtain a Certificate as a Personal Care Attendant, CPR, and First Aid. Students with and without Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities take classes to develop many work-related skills.

E4Texas has three goals. 1. Empower Texans to become self-determined & independent. 2. Educate Texans to gain employment skills, as well as professional and independent living skills. 3. Employ Texans in the area of Personal Care Attendants and related fields, and who will Excel in life! E4Texas is a tuition based program. Students who are current customers with the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) may qualify for assistance with tuition.
