Walk and Talk!

Parents/Guardians, recently, we introduced our morning **Walk and Talk** for students who are on campus prior to school starting. Please note the instructional school day begins at 7:50AM. We have permitted our students to be on campus as early as 7:35am (with staff supervision) as a way to begin their day socializing with friends, moving their bodies safely to start their day. This also helps with morning drop-off congestion and decreases the chances of students being tardy to class.

Check out this FAQ list:

- → Has the amount of supervision decreased during the morning drop-off?
 - ◆ NO! The amount of supervision during our morning drop-off time is the same.
- → Does Greenhills have recess during the school day?
 - ◆ YES! At Greenhills, we are very much in compliance with California law, 49056 (a), which requires students to receive at least 30 minutes of recess on regular instructional days and at least 15 minutes on early release days. Here at Greenhills, our TK/K students receive at least 35 minutes daily & our 1-3 receive at least 50 minutes a day.

- → Was piloting the Walk & Talk a team decision?
 - ◆ YES! Our teaching staff had a big part in implementing the idea of our Walk and Talk, and they are excited to join in with your students on the blacktop when they can.
- → Was this a safety decision?
 - ◆ YES! This is a big part of our decision as we are prepared for our all-school morning transition with 500+ students ages 3-9.
- → Does my student have to walk the whole time?
 - ◆ NO! Your student has the option to sit in chat with a friend in the morning.

EUSD Attendance Notes:

As we begin the new school year, we hope to support our students in attending school regularly and on time! We will be highlighting the importance of attendance throughout the school year, including helpful information with families. When to Keep Your Student Home From School Throughout the past several years, guidance has changed about when and when not a student should stay home from school if they are not feeling well. Please review the guidance below on when to keep your student home from school:

- If a student tests positive for COVID-19, there is no isolation requirement or negative test required, as long as their symptoms are improving and they are free of the following illness signs/symptoms
- Fever of 100.0 degrees or higher (students should be fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication before returning)
- Vomiting within the past 24 hours
- Diarrhea within the past 24 hours
- A contagious disease (e.g., strep throat, pink eye) unless advised to return by a medical provider
- Obvious illness or injury

Each tool has an icon, tagline, and hand gesture: **Breathing Tool-**

Icon: A tape measure

Tagline: I calm myself and check in.

Hand gesture: Touch thumbs and index fingers

together as if holding a tape

measure: slowly pull hands apart while taking a breath. On exhale, bring hands slowly back

together.

Ouiet/Safe Place Tool-

Icon: A pair of headphones or earmuffs *Tagline*: I remember my quiet/safe place.

Hand gesture: Cross your hands over your heart, tilt your head downward, and close your eyes.

School Drop off Tips

The start of a new school year is an exciting time! However, many students (and other family members) may experience some level of anxiety. Here are a few ways to help your Cub transition back to school:

Validate feelings before jumping to

reassurance: acknowledge, accept, and empathize with the feelings your child is experiencing. Once you name the feeling, you can help with problem solving.

Let your Cub know you believe in them!

Remind your child of ways they have been brave, or challenges they have faced in the past. **Establish a routine:** routines and rituals help students to cope. A calm routine in the

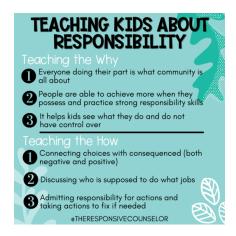
morning helps to set the tone for the day; additionally, a routine after school helps the student and caregiver reconnect.

Create a "goodbye" ritual: come up with a special way to separate at school and stick with it!

Tip- lingering can make separation anxiety worse for your student. School staff is available to help if needed!

Remind yourself that this is an adjustment for your child and family. However, with support from you and school staff, your child will adapt.
