

### Ekstrand Students Compete in California State Games

On July 17, Ekstrand Elementary students Violet Leiva and Liberty Siordia represented Bonita Unified with determination and excellence at the California State Games, a competition that brought together 10,000 of the state's top athletes across 10 sports at UC San Diego.

The Bobcats earned their spot on the statewide stage after strong showings at the San Dimas City Olympics, advancing to the San Gabriel Valley track meet and then the Southern California Municipal Athletic Federation Track and Field Championships in Downey.
