



Lunch Reminders

Can'ts:



Academic Honesty (Click here)

School staff make every effort to teach students about academic integrity as well as provide direct instruction about what counts as academic dishonesty:

- Cheating on tests, quizzes, & assignments AND/OR helping another to cheat on a test, quiz, or assignment
- Fabrication of academic materials
- Unauthorized collaboration with a peer
- Plagiarism / copying
- Alteration of materials / student work
- Forgery
- Theft of academic material
- Unauthorized digital access to the files or equipment of others
- Copying the work of another person/Giving work to another person to be copied
- Inappropriate use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) as previously indicated by my teacher

Attendance Policies (Click here)

Tardies

- Be in your class ready to learn when the bell rings
- 3 tardies = lunch detention
- No shows to detention automatically receive parent conference

Absences

- Parents/Guardians need to call in an absence to the Attendance Office
- You need to check in and out through the Attendance Desk
- If you are sick, go to the Health Office and they can call home

Truancy

- When an absence is not cleared/justified by a parent/guardian
- When you are unaccounted for in class, i.e., you leave class or campus without permission (called "ditching" or "cutting class")

Cell Phone Practices (Click here)

Cell Phones

- Cell phones will be TURNED OFF from the first bell to the last bell of the day.
- Cell phones and AirPods will be kept in the student's backpack/bag (not in clothing pockets).
- Cell phone use is not permitted at any time during break, lunch or passing periods.
- Cell phones are not allowed to be used in locker rooms or restrooms at any time.
 Taking photos or videos in these locations will result in an acceleration of consequences below.

Airpods/Earbuds

 Airpods/Earbuds are not permitted unless it is a documented accommodation for academic purposes.

Smart Watches

- Students who chose to wear smart watches must have them in "School mode" through the entirety of the school day.
- Students who have smart watches without "School mode" will be asked to put them away.

Am I allowed to use my student Gmail to email friends during school?

Some questions to think about:

- Did my teacher give me permission to use Gmail?
- Am I communicating something academic or school-related?
- Would I be comfortable with school staff printing the emails and sharing them with my parents in a parent conference meeting?

If the answer to any of these is no, then do NOT use your Gmail to email friends.



Student Transportation: Bikes, E-bikes, Scooters, E-scooters

All bike and scooter operators required to obtain a parking permit/tag (link here)

- Parent Signature on this document, turn in to Admin Assistant Lisa
 Graciano in the front office
- 2. Attend a Student Rider Safety Presentation (HOMEROOM, TUESDAY AUG 26th)
- 3. Complete the online knowledge check with a score of 100% (link here)

Walk all student "vehicles" with tires or wheels on sidewalk while on campus

Arriving to / Departing from Campus by Bike



DO THIS	DON'T DO THIS
Follow the green arrow path to arrive at school safely	Do not enter Canyon Crest Academy's campus marked by the red X's
Walk your bike on the sidewalk once on PTMS campus	Do not ride your bike on the sidewalk anywhere on PTMS campus
Follow all traffic safety laws when riding your bike in the street alongside car traffic (examples: stop signs, cones, lane dividers)	Do not ignore traffic safety laws (examples: running stop signs, ignoring cones, staff, or lane dividers)

Dress Code (Click here)

Clothing, jewelry, and personal items (hats, bike helmets, phone cases, binders, stickers, etc.) <u>may not</u>:

- advertise, promote, or glamorize any of the following: drugs, alcohol, tobacco products, violence, gang affiliation, weapons, inappropriate or sexually suggestive language or symbols.
- degrade or demean any ethnic background, national origin, religious belief, gender, gender orientation, sexual orientation, or disability.

Clothing <u>must</u> be sufficient to conceal undergarments (with the exception of bra straps) and buttocks as well as the majority of the chest and abdomen.

For safety purposes, shoes must be worn at all times.

Administration reserves the right to modify the dress code policy as styles change or new safety issues emerge

What happens if I receive a referral to administration?

Progressive Discipline Model:

- Warning and Phone Call Home
- Parent Conference
- Detention with a reflective learning assignment
- If applicable: Restorative Conversation with another student and/or staff member
- Behavior Contract (academics, behavior, attendance)
- Suspension (1-5 Days)

Loss of Privilege (Click here)

Both 7th and 8th grade students CAN be put on the LOP list for:

- receipt of two (2) or more disciplinary referrals to administration
- receipt of two (2) or more detentions (tardy detentions not included)
- any suspension (includes out-of-school suspension, in-school suspension, and class suspension)
- at administration's discretion

**Dr. Wild and Dr. Hake have the final say in LOP decisions.

Respect for Others

Use kind and appropriate language that is inclusive of all students on campus.

Harmful language includes:

- profanity / curse words
- words that degrade or demean any ethnic background, national origin, religious belief, gender, gender orientation, sexual orientation, or disability

Don't use it. Even if you're "joking." Hurting others isn't fun or funny.

Report harmful language when you hear it to a trusted adult: teacher, counselor, coach, or administrator. If you SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING!



The Wolfpack Way to Interrupt Bias

INTERRUPT

Speak up against every biased remark, every time it happens, without exception

- "I don't find that funny"
- "I'm surprised to hear you say that"
- "Using that term doesn't help others feel accepted here"

2_{QUESTION}

Ask simple, exploratory questions in response to bigoted remarks

- "Why did you say that?"
- "Tell me more"
- "What do you mean by that?"
- "Did you mean to say something hurtful?"

3_{EDUCATE}

Explain why the term or phrase is offensive

- "Do you know the history of that term?"
- "Do you know why we do not say that?"
- "Did you think of the impact of the term on others?

It's powerful to be the first voice that interrupts bias. It's powerful on another level to be the echoing voice

 "Thanks for speaking up. I agree that it is offensive and we shouldn't use it"





What is the Bystander Effect?

People are less likely to intervene and help another person when surrounded by other people than if they were alone.

This is because people often assume another person will intervene. If everyone makes the same assumption, then no one intervenes!

This means that we have the responsibility to report concerning behavior when we see it and not wait around for someone else to!



Examples of Bullying

Bullying will never be tolerated!

Bullying can be:

- Physical: pushing, shoving, punchng, hitting, spitting, etc.
- Verbal: name calling, teasing, hurtful jokes, threats, etc.
- Social: excluding others, gossiping, spreading rumors, etc.


Bullying can occur:

- On campus
- Off Campus
- Via Social Media



Report bullying and concerning behaviors to a trusted adult: teacher, coach, counselor, administrator, or parent/family.

Anonymous Reporting: WeTip



When to use WeTip: Examples of Concerning Behavior

- hurtful language, profanity, threats, or hate speech of any kind towards others or yourself
- disturbing social media posts about harming self or others
- unsafe use of technology, such as disabling firewalls or GoGuardian or interfacing with the public
- witnessing a crime (such as theft)

Note: If you don't add enough information to your report, it can be difficult to investigate.

Note: Do not misuse WeTip. WeTip is for serious reports only.
