- 3. How do we ensure general education access and opportunities for peer engagement for students with disabilities?
- 4. Are we actively collaborating with parents, students, and the IEP team to adapt and adjust plans as needed based on progress monitoring and changing circumstances?
- 5. Is the student's transition plan effectively addressing their post-secondary goals, current engagement levels, and realistic needs to prepare them for life beyond school?
