What is Title I?

Title I is a program that provides additional academic support and learning opportunities to support students who are at risk of falling behind.

All Title I funds are meant to supplement, not supplant, district funds.

In order to qualify for Title I schools must have at least 40% or more socioeconomic students to qualify.

Chaparral-Vista High School is a Targeted Assistance Title I School: Last year 66.7% of our student population was considered socioeconomically disadvantaged. Our school Operates a school wide program.

Goals of Title I

- Increase academic achievement
- Provide direct instructional support to students
- Provide professional development for teachers
- Promote parent education and involvement

Chap-Vista's Focus Goals

- Provide every student with a personalized educational plan to meet their needs.
- Provide a rigorous curriculum based on the California State Standards and Frameworks school-wide across all subject areas.
- Continue to seek reliable data to close the achievement gap by providing interventions and support to struggling students.
- Promote student achievement by continuing bi-monthly guidance periods to encourage self-monitoring of the Individual Growth Plan (IGP) and alternative academic settings to provide additional support for struggling students.
