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LCAP Goal 1: Establish a high-performing district culture with quality teaching and learning

Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP)

- Initiated planning for Summer Camp programming.
- Continued emphasis on academic reinforcement, student wellness, and social-emotional learning within expanded learning offerings.
- Monitored program quality, staffing, student participation, and compliance to ensure effective and equitable access.
- Attended the CDE-hosted **CTE Directors Meeting**, which included updates on CTE funding for 2026.
- Participated in the **CAN Site Directors Symposium** on February 4.
- LTIS remains at full capacity with 25 students enrolled: 13 WHS, 4 WIS, 6 MUR, and 2 WCHS.

Career Technical Education (CTE)

- Collaborating with CTE teachers to establish a **SkillsUSA chapter** within Willows Unified, while continuing to promote the **National Technical Honor Society**.
- Continuing participation in the **ACSA Aspiring Superintendent Academy** in Sacramento.
- Met with local North State medical leaders to address the **Medical Provider Shortage**, focusing on ways to support schools, districts, and county efforts in promoting medical career pathways.
- Attended the [**Career Compass**](#) Summit in Sacramento.
- Currently attending the [**Grants4Schools**](#) Conference in Seaside (February 5-6) a networking event specifically for grant writers in School Districts.

Community Schools (CCSPP)

- Invited by Chico State to present at their **26th Annual Economic Forecast Conference** on January 15, highlighting strategies to strengthen CTE pathways to support the North State workforce.
- Continuing recruitment efforts to identify a Wellness Coach for the Murdock site.
- Participated in interagency and community partner meetings to strengthen wraparound services, wellness supports, and referral systems.
