1. Narrative description of the Prop 28 arts education program(s) funded. (2500 character limit).

At every site, funding will be used in the following ways: Elementary and Secondary Arts Education Staff: At each school site, both certificated and classified staff will take on roles in leading and supporting performing, digital, and visual arts education. Additionally, arts education programming will be offered to students in both general and special education classroom settings. The staffing plan will include an additional 1.0 FTE Art teacher to be shared 0.6/0.4 between GHS and Sycamore, a 0.6 FTE Art teacher to be shared between McKinley and Wilson 0.2/0.4, and a 1.0 FTE Elementary Music Teacher to be shared between McKinley and Wilson 0.2/0.8. Should funding be sufficient to support an additional position depending on the cost of the above certificated teachers, it will be directed toward a supporting instructional aide to assist in preparing and delivering content to students. After-School Arts Education Opportunities: Each school site will have the opportunity to offer After School Art Programs, including drama, music, visual arts, and digital arts. These programs will be organized and led by certificated and/or classified staff. Community Partnerships Art Programs: By leveraging community resources, school sites will explore partnership with outside agencies to offer additional arts education programs, such as martial arts, dance, and photography, using funds remaining after the hiring of staff. Funding for these community agency contracts will support experiences that align with the goals of Proposition 28, as well as field trips that complement and enhance these objectives. Storage and Materials for a Comprehensive Arts Education Program: The arts education funded by Proposition 28 will require a wide variety of materials for visual, performing, and digital arts. These materials, along with storage resources, will be shared across school sites to ensure all programs have the necessary tools to succeed. Waiver for Unallocated Funds: The District will seek a waiver of the 80/20 staff to materials ratio once all above positions have been allocated to maximize the use of funds and provide needed materials to replace aging musical instruments in the districtwide music program.
