CLASS TITLE: BEHAVIOR SPECIALIST

BASIC FUNCTION: Under the direction of the Director of Special Education and Student Supports, the Behavior Specialist provides behavioral assessment, intervention, and consultative services to support students with behavioral and social/communication challenges through a trauma informed lens. The specialist develops and implements evidence-based behavioral interventions, conducts comprehensive assessments, and offers training to promote positive student outcomes within inclusive educational environments.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

- Conduct Functional Behavior Assessments (FBAs) and develop, implement, and monitor Behavior Intervention Plans (BIPs) in collaboration with Individualized Education Program (IEP) teams.
- Provide consultation and support to general and special education staff regarding behavioral strategies, classroom management, and individualized student support.
- Design and deliver professional development sessions for educators, paraprofessionals, and parents on topics related to Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA), Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), and behavior management techniques.
- Supervise and provide ongoing training to Registered Behavior Technicians (RBTs) and other paraprofessionals implementing behavior intervention plans.
- Supervise and train paraprofessionals and other staff involved in the implementation of behavior support plans, ensuring fidelity and effectiveness.
- Collaborate with multidisciplinary teams, including school psychologists, service providers and administrators, to support students with behavioral challenges.
- Participate in IEP meetings, providing data-driven insights and recommendations to support student success.
- Maintain accurate and timely documentation of assessments, interventions, progress monitoring, and communications with stakeholders.
- Stay current with best practices, research, and legal requirements related to behavior analysis and special education
- Assist in crisis intervention planning and provide support before, during and after behavioral emergencies.
- Perform other related duties as assigned by the Director of Special Education and Student Supports.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:

Any combination of training, experience, and/or education equivalent to a master's degree in applied behavior analysis, psychology, or related field; and three years of experience with students with behavioral needs in an education setting.

LICENSES AND OTHER REQIREMENTS:

- Possession of a valid license issued by the State of California as a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA).
- Possession of a valid California driver's license and availability of private transportation.

- Ability to work collaboratively with a multidisciplinary team.
- Proficiency in data collection, analysis, and interpretation to inform decision-making.
