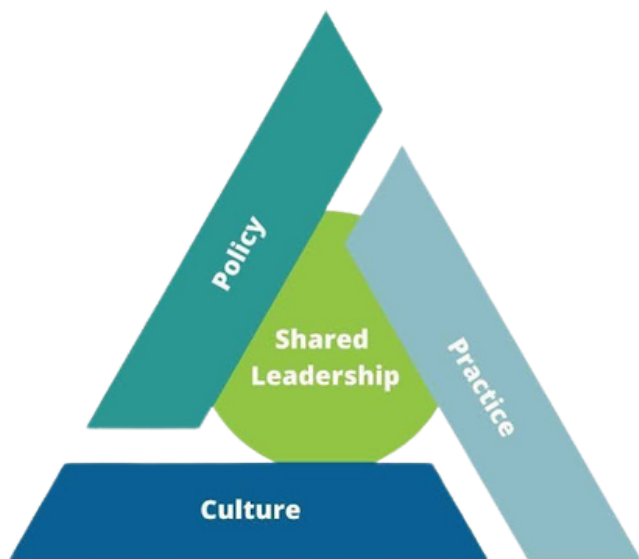

IMPACT:

Data indicate that districts who engage consistently with SIP over multiple years see significant positive movement on California's Least Restrictive Environment (LRE) indicators. **Across all SIP grantee districts, the percentage of students with IEPs educated in general education 80% or more of the day (Indicator 5a) rose an average of 8.8 percentage points — from 53.6% to 62.4% — between the year before joining SIP and 2024–25.** Gains grow with time in the project: grantees with **five or more years in SIP have gained an average of 11.0 percentage points (a 21% increase)** on this measure. Every SIP entry cohort has improved on Indicator 5a since joining.

For all LRE indicators (5a, 5b, and 5c) grantee performance moved in the desired direction:

- 5a — Grantees gained an average of +8.8 points since entering SIP. Gains rise with tenure: +6.6 at 3–4 years, +9.6 at 5–6 years, +11.6 at 7+ years. Improvement is roughly double the statewide pace between 2016 and 2024.
- 5b — general ed less than 40% of the day (lower is better). Grantees with 5+ years reduced 5b by 3.4 points (-16%); since 2016–17, SIP districts fell 4.4 points vs. 1.9 in non-SIP districts.
- 5c — separate settings (lower is better). Grantees with 5+ years reduced separate-setting placements by 0.5 points (-20%).

**SIP grantees are selected by the California Department of Education, Special Education Division. There is not an application process to become a SIP grantee.*

INCLUSION ACADEMIES
