


# Financial Aid: Paying for College and Careers











#### WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

- Money that helps students pay for college or career school.
- Provided by the Federal Government,
   State, Colleges or career schools, nonprofit or private organizations, community organizations, foundations or corporations.
- Available for ALL types of school.
- Students must submit a financial aid application (FAFSA, CSS Profile, or CA Dream Act).



#### **AB 469**

#### **AB 540**

California Law (AB 469) now requires **all** high school seniors, including undocumented students, to apply for the FAFSA or CA Dream Act (CADAA) or complete an **opt-out waiver**.

Effort to increase awareness of and access to financial aid.

Undocumented students who attend a CA school for 3 years AND receive a GED or Diploma qualify for AB 540.

## Need Based/ Gift Aid

**Need Based Aid = Free** 

Grants and Scholarships are need based.



### Non Need Based/ Self-help Aid

Non Need Based Aid = Earned/Loaned

This is money that has to be paid back or earned through employment.

Ex) Work-Study, Loans





#### **GRANTS**

- Needs Based
- Money does not have to be paid back
- Awarded from federal, state & university funds



#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

- Money that doesn't have to be paid back
- Merit/Talent/Need Based
- Private agencies, community centers, employers



#### **WORK-STUDY**

- Needs Based
- 10-20 hour week
- Fixed amount
- Paid to student



#### **LOANS**

- Borrowed money that has to be paid back with interest.
- Don't have to accept
- Can accept partial amounts
- Private Loans or "Alternative Loans" = money comes from lending instituions

## CALIFORNIA \* FINANCIAL AID 553





**Cal Grant** 

Provides eligible undergraduate students with assistance toward their tuition and non-tuition costs (Cal Grant B only) at a qualifying California college or university. The Cal Grant is a California-specific financial aid award that does not need to be paid back. Additional Cal Grant aid is available to eligible Foster Youth and Students with Dependent Children to further assist with non-tuition costs.



Middle Class Scholarship Provides eligible undergraduate students – with family incomes and asset up to \$234,000 for the 2025-26 academic year – a scholarship to attend a UC or CSU campus. Middle Class Scholarship awards vary based on the student's total cost of attendance and other forms of aid that they receive.



Golden State Teacher Grant Provides financial assistance to students working towards their preliminary teaching or pupil personnel services credential and who commit to working at a "priority school" or a State Preschool Program in California for a few years after completing their credential program.



CA Chafee Grant for Foster Youth

Provides eligible foster youth with up to \$5,000 a year for college or career education at any eligible California college or university, as well as schools in other states. Chafee grants can be used for tuition and non-tuition costs and do not have to be repaid.



CA Dream Act Service Incentive Grant

Provides grants to eligible California Dream Act applicants who perform a specified number of community or volunteer service hours.



Cal-HBCU Transfer Grant Awards one-time grant of up to \$5000 to students who complete the Associate Degree for Transfer at the California Community Colleges and who transfer to one of the Historically Black Colleges and Universities with the intention of returning to California.

#### **Financial Aid Programs**



Provides all newborns and eligible low-income public school children with initial seed deposits to start saving money for college, which can be linked to new or existing ScholarShare 529 accounts. Eligible low-income students may qualify to receive up to \$1,500 in college savings for their future.

#### INSTITUTIONAL FINANCIAL AID







CA Community College Promise Grant

For eligible California residents seeking to enroll in a community college, the California Community College Promise Grant (formerly known as the Board of Governors [BOG] Fee Waiver) waives tuition and fees.



State University Grant (CSU)

Provides need-based awards to eligible undergraduate and graduate/post baccalaureate students that covers partial or all tuition costs for students who are not already receiving a Cal Grant.



Blue & Gold Opportunity Plan (UC) Ensures that eligible California undergraduates at a UC campus with an annual family income of up to \$80,000 have their system wide tuition and fees covered. As part of a student's financial aid package, they will be awarded a combination of federal, state, institutional and/or private grants to cover their system wide tuition and fees.

#### FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID







**Pell Grant** 

Grants awarded to undergraduate students that demonstrate financial need and do not have to be repaid.



Federal Work-Study Provides eligible students with financial need at participating campuses with part-time employment to help reduce their educational costs.

for state and federal aid

- Two applications students only need to complete one every year they are in college
- 26-27 application period October 2025 March 2026 **UC/CSU** recommended deadline is March 2 California Community College deadline is Sept 3
- Apply once for many programs Pell Grant, 03FSEO Grant, Cal Grant, Middle Class Scholarship
- Financial need is determined by 04 household income in prior-prior year
- Parents must provide information for children until 05 they reach 24 or meet independent requirements

#### **Provide Consent**

- All contributors must provide consent

   form even if you didn't file any tax return at all.
- If you don't provide consent & approval, you will NOT be eligible for federal student aid.





#### Starting your FAFSA

- Determine which parent(s) will need to contribute to your FAFSA.
   (https://studentaid.gov/fafsa-apply/parents)
- 2. Student and parent(s) will need to create an FSA ID (studentaid.gov).
- 3. Dependent students will invite the parent account to contribute their financial information.
- 4. Dependent Student provides consent and approval.
- 5. Review Student Aid Index (SAI) for eligibility.

California Dream Act (CADAA)


#### **CA Dream Act Requirements:**

- Not have an SSN or have an SSN through Deferred Action (DACA), or have an ITIN
- Have a High School Diploma, GED or equivalent
- Qualify for AB540/AB200
- Professional email address
- Create username for student

DACA is <u>not required</u> to **complete CADAA**.

#### **Time Frame:**

October 1, 2025 - March 2, 2026

\* A year's equivalence at a California Community College is either a minimum of 24 semester units of credit or 36 quarter units. For noncredit courses, a year's attendance is a minimum of 420 class hours per year (a semester is equivalent to a minimum of 210 hours and a quarter is equivalent to a minimum of 140 hours). Full-time attendance at a California adult school is a minimum of 420 hours of attendance for each school year.

#### **Student Aid Index**

**SAI** is an eligibility index number that will be used as a factor to determine the financial need of the student. The calculation will be used by colleges, states, and other scholarship providers to determine financial aid packages.

For example: SAI of -1500 to 0 will qualify you for maximum Pell Grant



#### **Special Circumstances**

### Adjustments can be made on a case by case bases:

- Dependency Status
- Loss of income or investments
- Increase of child support paid or decrease of child support received
- Change in number of household size
- Additional expenses for medical or dental (not covered through insurance)




## Each college and university will send their college award offers.

- Some will require paperwork in order to distribute funds
- Can only accept one

#### **How Colleges Calculate your Financial Need**

\$80,000 (COA) - \$10,000 (SAI)- \$0 (OFA) = \$70,000 (Financial Need)

Colleges will try to cover all or some of your financial need using a combination of loans, grants, scholarships and work-study.



#### **Common Application Mistakes**

For the CADAA and FAFSA\*\*



Using the **same email account** for the parent and student



Selecting that student has already received a Bachelor's degree



Including assets that should be excluded (value of primary residence, retirement plans, etc.)



Not using your **full legal name** on the FAFSA



Applying for financial aid is NOT the same as applying for college, and a college application is not applying for financial aid



Listing only **one college** 



FAFSA will be deleted if incomplete within 45 days of starting



Not approving and consenting to **Direct Data Exchange** 






