1. Narrative description of the Prop 28 arts education program(s) funded. (2500 character limit).

The Rocklin Unified School District used the 2023-24 Prop 28 funding to expand and enhance the arts at all school levels. In elementary schools, the music program was expanded from two teachers for twelve elementary schools to six teachers for twelve elementary schools allowing for instruction in string instruments, band, and chorus for all 4th, 5th, and 6th grade students. A Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) teacher was also added in elementary schools to provide VAPA classes to special education students. The existing VAPA program for elementary schools was also expanded by 0.20 FTE to accommodate district growth in this program. At the middle school level, two Art Teachers were added, one at each middle school, to teach visual and performing arts. A 0.50 Art Teacher was also funded at the Alternative High School to provide greater access to the arts for students enrolled there. Finally, each comprehensive high school was provided \$15,000 for stipends to expand and enhance existing arts-related programs. Materials and supplies monies were shared with school sites based on state school allocations to support visual art, music, performing arts, and classroom art integration at all levels.
