Career Technology Education (CTE) Programing Available In HCS

On Wednesday, October 15, 2025, the HCS Board of Education attended the Livingston County School Board Association meeting. Board members had the opportunity to learn about all that Hartland High School students have access to through the CTE Shared-time Program in Livingston County. Below is information regarding the CTE program and offerings available to all high school students including LEGACY and Hartland Virtual Academy students. Hartland high school students have the same opportunities as the students in the other public high schools. Students can participate in Flight, EMT, Fire Fighter, Manufacturing, Auto, Construction, Agricultural Science, Health Occupation courses, and so much more. Please take a moment to review the following resources to learn about all that we offer in Hartland or through a partnership with one of the county high schools. This program is designed as a shared-time program because the county does not have a career technology education center, which many counties provide as a central hub for this work. Sometimes people do not realize that CTE programs offered in another county school district are available to HCS students, not just the home district. This is why we called it a shared time program, because we share students.

We are excited to work in collaboration with all our public school district partners to offer these opportunities to students who wish to engage and pursue learning through a career technology perspective.

2024- Livingston County CTE

- 2,844 students enrolled in CTE (37% of the county high school population)
- 40 CTE programs in Livingston County (Hartland Students have access to many)
- 23 unique programs and 18 shared campus programs
- Earned 281 state approved credentials and 750 supplemental credentials

High School Job Experience Opportunities for Juniors and Seniors

Hartland High School, in partnership with Livingston ESA's Career Development Department has planned a county-wide, bi-annual event, Liv Co Job Shadow Day, on Wednesday, November 13 - Friday, November 15, 2025. This is a one-day activity designed to show Juniors and Seniors a bit about what a day in the life of different careers is like. There are many diverse opportunities for students to shadow, ranging from aircraft mechanics to veterinarians to HVAC technicians. Sign-ups for students start on October 15th at 7:00 p.m. Students can register and sign up on the same day!

Registration involves a parent signature to confirm students' permission to participate. Students can preview the website ahead of time to see what Job Shadow Opportunities are available at the [Livingston Career Hub](#) and their [Job Shadow Day Registration Videos](#). Please note that career availability is on a first-come, first-served basis, so it would be a good idea to have a list of the top five choices. Students will receive a confirmation email after they sign up for a job shadow. Some careers require extra paperwork, so please check that out ahead of time. Extra forms are attached to the Job Shadow Profile. All extra forms are due to the employer via email by November 6th, or the job shadow will be canceled. Students can see their counselors or CTE teachers for more information. It's a great way to check out different careers to see if it's the one for them.

Elementary: November 3 – November 14

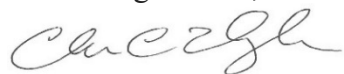
Farms and Middle School: November 17 – 25
