Sequoia High School is a fully accredited comprehensive public high school with an enrollment of approximately 1,839 students. We have an authorized International Baccalaureate program. We have been recognized as a Title I Academic Achievement Award. Our school community has a wide economic divide with families from Redwood City, San Carlos and East Palo Alto (24% of our parents did not graduate from high school, 17% are four year college graduates, 28% have graduate degrees or higher). We provide a Chromebook for all students and some students can only access the internet while at school.

Our 9 Middle College students who take classes at Cañada Community College are not included in this grade distribution, as they do not take classes at our high school in the 11th and 12th grades.

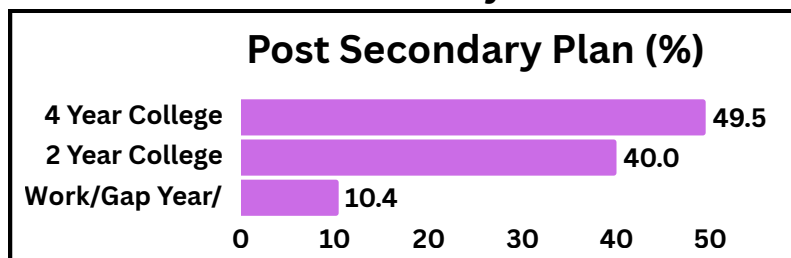

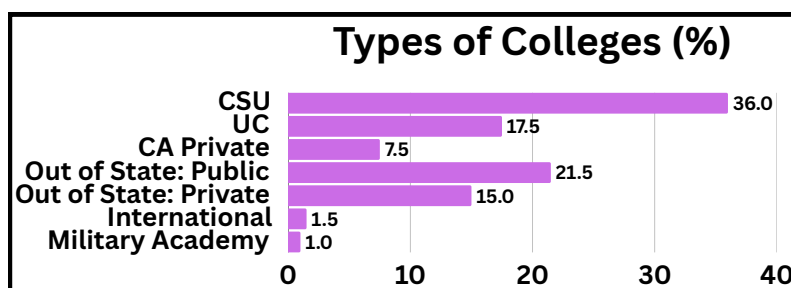
DISTRICT GPA POLICIES

Academics

Our students come from 23 feeder schools, some do not offer world language, algebra or geometry. Our district policy requires students enroll in **6 classes** per semester. Students taking Advanced XL Dance, ASB, AVID, Band, Entrepreneurship, Choral, Java, Journalism, Mobile Apps, Orchestra, Drama, Student Clerk, Student Leadership, Support Classes, Theory of Knowledge, Woods II/III, or students in the Digital Arts Academy or Health Careers Academy are allowed to take 7 classes.

Specialized Academic & Support Programs

- **Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID)** 9th-12th Grade. Sequoia’s AVID is for students with a 2.0-3.5 GPA who want to attend a four-year college directly after high school. Students are predominantly from under-resourced families and 1st generation. Students take a 7th period grade level AVID class each year. There are **193** students in the AVID Program.
- **Health Career Academy (HCA)** 10th-12th Grade. The HCA provides a rigorous, equitable and interdisciplinary academic program that prepares students for college level study in healthcare fields or a career in health care upon graduation. Students are required to take an elective exclusive to the HCA each year: CTE Intro to Health Professions (10th), CTE Medical Clinical I (11th) and CTE Medical Clinical II (12th). There are **148** students in the HCA.
- **Digital Arts Academy (DAA)** 10th-12th Grade. Focused on providing students with a technology-infused, personalized learning experience while preparing all for college and careers. DAA has a strong mentor program that partners with local industries in the Silicon Valley. Students are required to take an elective exclusive to the DAA each year: Multimedia I (10th), CTE Multimedia II (11th), and CTE Multimedia III (12th). There are **144** students in the DAA.
- **Boys and Girls Club of the Peninsula (BGCP)** Located at Sequoia and at their clubhouses in Redwood City and East Palo Alto, BGCP offers enrichment, tutoring and college access groups to all Sequoia students at no cost. Many of our underserved students are BGCP members.

Sequoia’s IB Program

We encourage all students to take at least 1 IB course before graduation. IB courses with prerequisites include: IB Bio (Chemistry), IB Physics (Physics), IB ESS (Biology, Chemistry or Physics), IB Chemistry (Chemistry), IB Visual Arts (Art or Draw/Paint), IB Spanish (Spanish 2/3 ICAP, Spanish III or Spanish III NS), IB French (French 2/3 ICAP or French III). IB courses with recommended courses: IB English (English I and II ICAP in 9th and 10th), IB History (World History ICAP in 10th). All Health Career Academy and Digital Arts Academy students take IB English.

Standard Level IB courses (SL) at Sequoia are typically one-year courses (150 instruction hours, similar to AP). IB Spanish SL, IB French SL, IB ESS, and sometimes IB Visual Arts SL are taught over two years at a more relaxed pace. Higher Level IB courses (HL) are taught over two years (240 instruction hours, exploring subjects in greater depth, breadth and complexity). All students taking IB courses are strongly encouraged to take the corresponding exam(s). Due to budget limits, Sequoia does not provide predicted IB scores to domestic institutions. Payment plans and reduced cost exams are available for families.

Participating in Sequoia’s IB Diploma impacts course selection. IB Diploma students may not have room in their schedule for courses allowed as a 7th class while completing IB’s TOK requirement. Students with ASB Leadership positions and Class Presidents are required to enroll in Leadership-ASB for the entire school year, preventing participation in the IB Diploma. Due to funding limitations, students are not allowed to enroll in 8 classes (except an AVID Diploma student simultaneously enrolled in TOK and AVID). Sequoia does not cap the number of Higher Level (HL) courses students can take. However, per IB policy, full IB Diploma students can only sit for a max of 4 HL exams.

A community college professor teaches three rotating Cañada College honors level courses on our campus Linear Algebra, Multivariable Calculus, Differential Equations; one course per semester. These courses are not included on the students' high school transcripts. Multivariable Calculus and Differential Equations are being taught in the 25-26 school year.

IB Math Course Help

All of our IB Math courses listed below teach all domains of math (Algebra, Functions, Geometry & Trigonometry, Statistics and Calculus):

- IB Applications SL - with a focus on Statistics. It includes basic Calculus.
- IB Applications HL - with a focus on advanced Statistics. It includes substantial Calculus.
- IB Analysis SL - with a focus on Calculus.
- IB Analysis HL- with a focus on advanced Calculus.

We combined IB Math SL/HL Y1 on transcripts according to student's individual pathway.
