LCAP Goal 1: High-Quality Teaching and Learning. Instructional improvement and staff capacity-building remain a priority.

Shout-Out, our students have successfully completed the **ELPAC** test thanks to the exceptional efforts of our ELD team: Kate, Nicole, Erika, Tanya, and Cathy. The team demonstrated a high level of organization, preparation, and commitment throughout the process. Each student was provided with a quiet, structured testing environment and supported by a skilled, caring adult during individual one-on-one assessments. This level of intentional planning ensured that students were well-prepared and able to fully access this rigorous assessment. We are proud of the systems and support our team put in place, and deeply appreciate their dedication to meeting the needs of all learners. Murdock is stronger because of their work and commitment to student success.

LCAP Goal 2: Student Engagement, Support, and Wellness-Supporting the whole child remains central to our work.

Our **PRE-SST** process has strengthened our ability to support teachers and students early and effectively. Through this process, we meet with teachers to review concerns, interventions already attempted, and each student's history, including academic, social-emotional, and physical factors. In alignment with our agreement with GCOE, we are holding firm that SST meetings are only initiated when there is a suspected

learning disability. PRE-SST allows us to better support teachers in addressing student needs without defaulting to SST for students who are simply not yet at grade level. This shift ensures more targeted support, efficient use of time, and a stronger focus on appropriate interventions for all students.

LCAP Goal 4: Family & Community Engagement highlights

Murdock Elementary is excited to share a collaborative effort between our PTO and ELOP program to fund new **shade structures** on campus. We have an enthusiastic PTO group ready to take this on, with plans to install some structures this year and continue expanding next year. In addition, I will be allocating over \$20,000 from the site principal budget to support this project. This reflects a strong partnership focused on improving student safety, comfort, and access to outdoor spaces. We are grateful for the continued support of our PTO and ELOP teams as we work together to do what's best for students.
