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NEISD FAMILY ENGAGEMENT LEADERSHIP ACADEMY DOMAINS



I. Parenting

Workshops offered in this domain will benefit adult-and-child relationships by providing participants the opportunity to learn skills that promote healthy families and healthy relationships within them. Different parenting styles, techniques, worldviews, and beliefs will be explored. Behavior management strategies in the home, parent-child relationships, child developmental stages, as well as mental health and Social Emotional Learning (SEL) strategies will be addressed. Participants will engage in role-playing, group discussions, and sharing best practices.



II. Life Skills and Essential Knowledge

Workshops offered in this domain will provide participants the opportunity to learn or enhance skills that can be beneficial in managing everyday life experiences. These workshops will include, but are not limited to technology training with an emphasis on computer literacy, vocational awareness, language acquisition, financial literacy, and awareness of available community resources.



III. Academic Skills

Workshops offered in this domain will provide parents or guardians the opportunity to learn how to assist their children with skills necessary to become academically successful. Curriculum and literacy skills in the areas of math, reading, language arts, science, and historical and cultural awareness will be covered. Participants will be empowered to support their children through the educational process including college and career readiness.



IV. Health, Nutrition and Safety

Workshops offered in this domain are for the benefit of the entire family. Workshops will promote healthy lifestyles in the home, family, school, and community. Topics may consist of but not limited to health and wellness topics, nutritional education, substance abuse prevention, preventable diseases, and safety education.



V. Leadership and Community Service

Participants are encouraged to give back to their campus community through volunteering and/or leadership roles benefiting the school, its students and families. Examples include: Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA), Parent Teacher Association (PTA), Watch DOGS, Campus Improvement Committee (CIC), Language Proficiency Assessment Committee (LPAC), PTA Clothes Closet, Parental Involvement Committee (PIC), and/or other volunteer opportunities available to adults at their respective campuses.

ÁREAS DE ENFOQUE DE LA ACADEMIA DE LIDERAZGO EN COMPROMISO FAMILIAR DE NEISD



I. Crianza de los hijos


