

Following this timeline will support you in your college and career exploration! Reminders:

- GPA Eligibility: California State University (CSU) - 2.5 GPA, University of California (UC) - 3.0 GPA
- To be eligible for a CSU or UC, you must complete at least 15 A-G courses.

FALL

- Get to know your advisor, counselor, and other college resources available (school/community)
- Does your school have a college program that could guide you through the college planning process? Check out your school's college center and apply for a program. See if there are any CEP programs at your school.
- Keep your grades up! (Colleges do not accept D or F grades). Get tutoring in subjects that are difficult for you.
- Apply to scholarships and summer programs open to 9th and 10th graders
- Ask family, teachers, and mentors about their college experience
- Create a professional email to use for all college exploration purposes
- Create free accounts and explore self, career, and major options:
 - [California Colleges](#): Discover your interests and values and find careers and colleges to reach your goals.
 - [California Career Zone](#): Learn which careers fit you and the next steps to pursuing college!
 - [College Board](#): Explore careers, identify majors for the career, and colleges that offer that major.

- Find an extracurriculars you are excited about (club, sport, leadership, volunteer, community programs, etc.)
- READ as much as you can; it will help you develop new ideas and build your vocabulary

SPRING

- Begin to talk to your parents about your college plans!
- Explore summer school options to get ahead: Community college, summer programs, etc.
- Meet with your counselor to discuss summer plans & update the 4-year A-G courses planner and options for next year's honors, AP, or dual enrollment courses.
- Look for a summer job and/or volunteer work.
- Continue researching colleges (online, field trips, tours, college fairs, etc.)

SUMMER

- If you received a D or F, you should be attending summer school!
