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LCAP Goal 1: Establish a high-performing district culture with quality teaching and learning

Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP)

- Continued Summer Camp planning, including program design, staffing coordination, and enrichment partnerships.
 - Attended the California Afterschool Network Site coordinator Event to strengthen understanding of compliance, funding structures, and best practices for high-quality expanded learning programs. Made some excellent connections and received advice for planning PD for our SPARK teachers.
 - Continued emphasis on academic reinforcement, student wellness, and social-emotional learning within expanded learning offerings.
 - Monitored program quality, staffing, student participation, and compliance to ensure effective and equitable access.
 - LTIS enrollment currently remains stable, with continued monitoring of student progress and completion rates across sites. WE are at 23 as of Monday with two intakes this week.

Career Technical Education (CTE)

- Continued collaboration with CTE teachers to establish a SkillsUSA chapter within Willows Unified while promoting the National Technical Honor Society.
 - Working closely with Alyssa Schager and GCOE regarding Career Trees implementation and Mark Perna framework alignment to strengthen pathway awareness and workforce relevance.
 - Continued participation in the ACSA Aspiring Superintendent Academy, focusing on systems leadership and district-level improvement strategies.
 - Follow-up work from the Career Compass Summit and medical pathway discussions to strengthen career-connected learning opportunities aligned to regional workforce needs.
 - Ongoing coordination with CTE instructors to implement strategies and updated information gathered from ACTE to enhance pathway rigor and industry alignment.

Community Schools (CCSPP)

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- Continued recruitment efforts to identify a Wellness Coach for the Murdock site to strengthen on-site student support.
 - Participated in interagency and community partner meetings to strengthen wraparound services, wellness supports, and referral systems.
 - Supported student-centered coordination meetings to ensure continuity of services and academic engagement.
 - Continued collaboration with North State RTAC to align Community Schools implementation with regional priorities and sustainability planning.
 - Supported planning efforts for the Spring Wellness Walk scheduled for March 14, 2026, at Sycamore Park, led by bilingual Community Schools Liaisons to promote family engagement and community wellness.
