

Dear RBHS student,

As you embark on your quest for college and money to help you attend college, this handbook can serve as one tool you can use to obtain information about scholarships. Scholarships are usually provided by companies or individuals who believe in the benefit of a college education and believe in helping students financially achieve that goal.

This information is a service to you from Red Bluff High School. It is not meant to be a listing of all scholarships available. It is a compilation of scholarship information that we have information on as a school. Locating, applying, and getting scholarships is very time consuming. Those who work the hardest at scholarship searches will probably reap the most benefits.

Scholarships have criteria and deadlines. Criteria can range from GPA qualifications or perimeters, to financial need, to community service, etc. The provider is giving the money away, so they can set the criteria however they see fit. They also all have deadlines. If you miss the deadline, you miss out. Sometimes providers change their deadlines after publications are complete.

So, deadlines listed in this handbook are APPROXIMATE (based on previous year's deadlines). Be proactive and do scholarship searches early and often to know what is expected and to know the accurate deadline.

Another suggestion is to sign up with an online scholarship bank. You can find many choices listed under the "Other Scholarships" link on our webpage. You create a profile, and they will send you information on scholarships that may fit you.

Again, scholarships take work. Most of them don't come find you. You must find them. As far as the listing of monthly scholarships, some have websites to download applications, and some applications can be obtained in the Counseling Center. Good luck in your search for scholarship money. If you have questions now or throughout the year, make an appointment with your counselor.

* Indicates a local scholarship. These applications will be available for you to download as they become available on the Senior Scholarship page. You can also come into the office and ask Rosie to print the application for you.

September

Check out these institutions and if you are interested in applying and attending one of the following schools, talk to your counselor to see if you could be nominated for one of their special programs.

Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri-Danforth Scholars Program provides full or partial tuition. This program honors students who embrace high ideals and whose life choices are guided by personal integrity, selflessness, a commitment to community, and a dedication to leadership and academic excellence.

University of Dayton, Ohio (top-tiered national Catholic university) provides a \$2,500 renewable scholarship to students who are selected to be a Leadership in Service Scholarship recipient. They are looking for students who have an innate desire for personal development and committed to service within their school, church, or community. Must meet the University of Dayton admission standards but the scholarship is not merit based.

Navy ROTC-Immediate Scholarship Reservation (ISR)

Selected applicants must gain admittance to their university of choice on their own initiative. The university must have a Navy ROTC unit – more than 153 of our nation's leading colleges and universities do. While selectees may major in any field and must take a normal course load required for their degree, their curriculum must also include nine Naval Science courses, and one year each of Calculus, Physics, National Security Policy/US Military Affairs, English Grammar and Composition, and World Culture/Regional Studies. Upon degree completion, each selectee will be commissioned as an officer in the US Navy, and will serve a minimum five-year active duty service obligation.

Minimum standards for an ISR scholarship:

- Must be a US citizen with no criminal record or history of drug use
- Must be a high school senior in the top 20% of their class
- Have qualifying SAT scores (550 critical reading, 600 math; 1230 combined) or ACT scores (22 English, 26 math, 54 combined)
- Applicant should exhibit leadership qualities through significant extra-curricular activities and be regarded as a role model by teachers and peers

Award: Full tuition and other financial benefits up to \$180,000.

See your counselor if you meet the qualifications and want to be nominated.

OppU Achievers Scholarship

To apply for the OppU Achievers Scholarship, submit a short essay responding to the prompted question. For an idea of what our review committee is looking for, take a look at these [scholarship essay examples](#) from past recipients.

Scholarship decisions are based solely on an applicant's essay response. Winners for the OppU Achievers Scholarship are selected four times a year, **with submission deadlines on September 30, December 31, March 31, and June 30.**

To be eligible for the OppU Achievers Scholarship, a student must:

- Be enrolled full time in high school or at least part time in college, graduate, professional, or trade school.
- Possess a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0/4.0.

- Has a minimum cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Is a citizen or legal permanent resident of the United States or Canada
- Plans to attend an accredited post-secondary educational institution in the United States or Canada, full-time or part-time
- attend in the fall of the academic year following high school graduation
- Is recommended by and receives the vote of a P.E.O. Chapter

This contest is open to all high school students. It consists of two segments: the first will be a speech 8-10 minutes in length concerning some phase of U.S. Constitution. The second segment consists of a speech on an assigned topic. The topic will be one of the four amendments identified in this year's instructions. This speech will be 4-6 minutes in length.

Award: First place winner of the local contest will receive \$150 scholarship, 2nd place-\$100, 3rd place-\$50. Winners of the various elimination rounds of completion are working their way to the final prize of \$18,000.
