A high percentage of the area's residents are college graduates, including business people, professionals, and military personnel. Within the San Antonio area are 5 military bases, 8 colleges or universities, a medical complex with associated medical and health science schools, and a law school.

## SCHOOL COMPOSITION

A comprehensive public high school of 2300 students including grades 9-12, Winston Churchill High School is one of seven high schools in the North East Independent School District. The senior class enrollment is 585 students.

## CURRICULUM

Our faculty provides a multi-level curriculum, including Advanced Placement, Dual Credit, ON-Ramps, Gifted/Talented, Honors, Regular, and Developmental courses that give students the opportunity to pursue unique programs that meet their individual needs. In addition to academics, a wide variety of extracurricular activities are available to our students in the areas of Athletics, Band, Choir, Dance, Debate, Journalism, Orchestra, ROTC, Spirit Groups, Theatre and Visual Arts.

Churchill offers 27 AP and 24 Honors courses in the areas of English, Math, Science, Social Studies, World Language, Fine Arts, and Computer Science.

A variety of Career & Technical courses are offered in the areas of Health Science, Human Services, Business, Technology, Engineering, and Video Technology. There are also opportunities for cooperative work programs, clinical rotations, automotive technology, welding, and HVAC programs.

Churchill, in partnership with San Antonio College, also offers dual credit in English IV, College Algebra, As well, Churchill has a partnership with UT Austin to offer On-Ramps Courses in English and Math.

## ACCREDITATION

Churchill High School is accredited by the Texas Education Agency and is a member of the College Board. CEEB Code 446-273.

## CLASS OF 2024 PROFILE

The Class of 2024 had 93 Summa Cum Laude graduates, 71 Magna Cum Laude graduates and 100 Cum Laude graduates.

Seventy three percent of Churchill High School 447 graduates were accepted to a post-secondary institution: 39% planned to attend a 4-year institution and 40% planned to attend a 2-year program. Three percent planned to serve in the armed forces.

The Class of 2024 was offered a total of \$6,280,975 in scholarships.

The 2024 Senior Class had 1 National Merit Semi-Finalists, 1 National Merit Commended Scholars and 24 College Board National Recognition Scholars

Students will choose one of five **Endorsement** options: Multidisciplinary Studies, STEM, Business and Industry, Public Services, or Arts and Humanities. Each endorsement requires specific courses, usually 4-5 credits in a concentrated area.

Students may also earn a **Performance Acknowledgment** through Dual Credit, ON Ramps Bilingualism/Biliteracy, Languages Other than English, Advanced Placement, PSAT/SAT/ACT, or a Business Certification or License.

## NEISD Does Not Rank

Required graduation courses, up to a maximum of 26 credits, taken in grades 9-12 through the end of the seventh semester will be used to calculate Class Rank. *The following are excluded from rank/GPA: courses repeated/taken more than once, high school courses taken in middle school, pass/fail credit classes, courses completed through credit by exam, courses taken in summer foreign study, or with an ARD exemption.*

Certain courses are Weighted for GPA factors are used to calculate the rank points for each course:

- Advanced Placement (AP): 1.15
- Honors, non-AP Dual Credit & GT: 1.08
- Regular: 1.00

Honor graduates are designated by using the student's 7th semester overall weighted grade point average. Students must be on the Foundation High School Program-Distinguished Level of Achievement to be an honor graduate.
