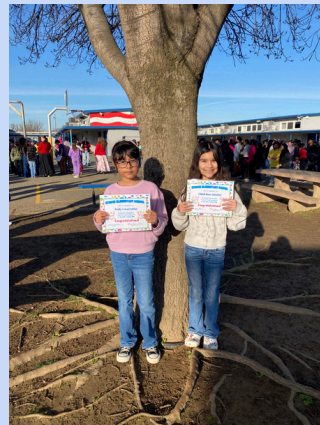
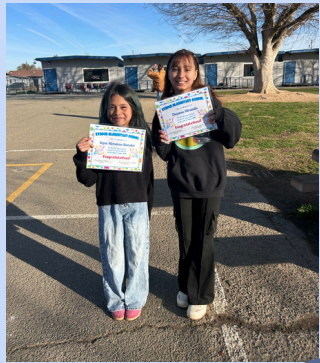




## Kynoch's STAR award for February

# 2nd Grade Field trip to Sutter County Museum

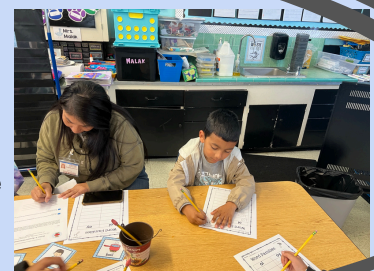
