! Reminder: Late Arrival Procedures

Classroom instruction starts promptly at 8:30 a.m., and all students are expected to be in their classrooms by then, as attendance is taken immediately. If your child arrives after 8:30, the main gate will be closed, and you will need to enter through the front office. At the office, you must sign your child in using the Late Arrival book, pick up a Late Slip from the attendance clerk, and make sure your child brings that slip to their teacher to be marked present. This process helps keep attendance records accurate and avoids disrupting the learning environment.

We understand that some parents have expressed concern about the front gate being closed at 8:30 a.m. Please note that this is not a new policy—school has always started at 8:30 sharp. Closing the gate at 8:30 supports our goal of maintaining a consistent, focused learning environment from the very start of the day.

Please stay informed by reading the **Parent-Student Handbook**, watching the **video guide available on our school's YouTube channel**, and checking your **ParentSquare messages regularly**. These resources provide clear guidance on school routines, expectations, and policies. We rely on our communication platforms to keep everyone informed efficiently and equally.

For parents of Kindergarten through 2nd grade students, please note that young children often have difficulty completing the sign-in information themselves. To help speed up the process and avoid backups in the office, we ask that a parent come inside with their child and sign them in personally. This ensures everything is done correctly and your child can get to class quickly.

Please remember to park in a proper spot and avoid blocking the driveway or leaving your car unattended. If your child is late because of a doctor's appointment, bring the doctor's note and give it to the attendance clerk when signing in.

Thank you for helping us keep our morning routine safe, smooth, and on time!

! Early Dismissal Procedure Reminder

We'd like to take a moment to revisit and clarify our dismissal procedures. As the school year continues, it's important that all families follow the established routines to ensure a smooth, safe, and efficient process for students, staff, and parents alike.

Dismissal is a coordinated effort — teachers are helping students pack up and guiding them to the appropriate areas; bus riders are escorted to their lines; ASP paras lead students to supper; and other campus supports move to their assigned dismissal gates. To keep this process organized, we need everyone's cooperation.

Please take note of the following important reminders:

- If your child will not be riding the bus or attending ASP on a given day, you
 must notify the front office no later than 2:30 PM. We encourage you to
 call as early as possible to avoid confusion during the busy dismissal time.
- Students who are not riding the bus or staying in ASP will be dismissed through their assigned dismissal gates.
- Gate assignments are as follows:
- · Front/Morse Gate: Families with last names A-M
- Northrop Gate: Families with last names N–Z
- K Gate: Kindergarten students and their siblings

Following these procedures helps keep our dismissal process safe, timely, and orderly. Thank you for your continued support and cooperation in making our school a safe and efficient place for all.
