Transportation Audit Shared

The Board of Education directed me to hire a company to audit our transportation department after the district initiated a pause process for transportation at the end of the first semester last year. The Ammon Consultation Group was hired to perform this function. At the June 16, 2025 Board of Education Meeting, findings were shared.

Project	The following were the key areas of focus for the study:
Scope	 Evaluating the efficiency and effectiveness of operations
Summary	 Conducting a community survey on transportation concerns
S GIIIII J	Addressing the persistent driver shortage

The findings of this report indicated that the district should reflect on the following:

- Adding technology for tracking and parent use such as the new Transportation App I shared this with parents recently.
- When looking for efficiency, an unintended consequence may result in less buses thus longer ride times. This often leads to less ridership which counters efforts at providing a positive service.
- Competitive Salary alone is not enough. Continue to create opportunities for flexible driving and rapid employment when interest is shown. Be aware that entry level compensation is a factor to attract drivers.
- Parents in HCS indicated that the pause scenario is the best option if a driver shortage continues. However, parents require ample notification and a clearly defined duration for the pause.
- Retention occurs by ensuring the culture is one of supportive and positive engagement between all within the department.
- Consider hiring a dedicated recruiter/marketing person.

HHS Students Visit France

Hartland High School students visited so many places, and burned the candle at both ends, on their trip to Europe and it was amazing! The French and Spanish students did a whirlwind 10-day tour of Europe. The French students had an 8-hour layover in Montreal, so they did a guided bus tour of the city. Students saw the biodome, took pictures and saw the city from the top of Mount Royal, got a glimpse of the preparations for the Grand Prix racetrack for the following weekend, and learned all about the city.

These students joined up with the full group in Paris for four days and walked through the renovated Notre Dame Cathedral, explored the Latin Quarter, had a guided tour of the city, saw the Arc de Triomphe, walked up to the top of the Eiffel Tower, had a sunset boat ride down the Seine River, explored the Louvre (saw the Mona Lisa), visited the city of Montmartre, and were able to see inside the Sacre Coeur cathedral.

The group then took a train to Barcelona for a two-day stay. While there they visited Montjuic, had a walking tour of Las Ramblas & the gothic district, had a guided tour of the Guell hospital and Park Guell (where Gaudi lived for the last 20 years of his life), visited the famous Sagrada Familia, took a bike tour of the city, swam in the Mediterranean Sea, and had a flamenco lesson.

They then took the bullet train to Madrid for the final two days. The group explored the Prado Museum, walked around the city, saw the famous bullfighting ring, had a guided tour of the Royal Palace, and went to the medieval fortress city of Toledo.

As stated, they hardly slept but had the most amazing time and memories! The World Language staff have continued to provide yearly cultural experiences for the HHS students and plan to continue to do so as a premiere school of choice.
