 - Great turnout for Back-To-School Night (August 14th).
 - Professional Development-Teachers participating in the Chico Math Project (5th grade, 6th grade, 7th and 8th grade) through Glenn County Office of Education.
 - Mr. Siplin and Ms. Porter (5th grade) are attending a School Climate Culture Conference October 1st and 2nd in Winters.
 - Students began Map Testing the week of August 18th.
 - Northern Valley Indian Health will have a clinician on campus five days a week.
 - Glenn County Behavioral will also provide services to students who need more intense intervention counseling.
 - Girls (7th and 8th grade) volleyball season is under way.
 - Soccer tryouts begin the week of August 25th.
 - Hired an additional Bilingual Instructional Aide scheduled to start in September.
 - School Site Council group has been finalized with the first meeting on 9/25/25 at 3pm in the WIS library.
 - PTO held its first meeting on 8.21.25.
 - Ms. LaCombe will be substituting in Ms. Hill's class until January while she is on maternity leave.
 - Classroom walkthroughs began this week using the program Progress Advisor.
 - Many students have commented on how good the lunches are this year.
 This has been shared with the Food Service Department.
 - Maintenance has been working hard to repair/restore AC units that have stopped working for a short period of time (usually a couple hours).
 - We currently have 436 students on site.
