misty morning mittens

details: Is knitting in-the-round a technique you don't feel ready for? Then the Misty Morning Mittens are for you! These mittens are knit flat and then seamed. They whip up so fast you could have a new pair for your misty morning walk!



MATERIALS + INFO

specs

Quick + Easy Collection Pattern #1002
Designed by Heather Walpole

Finished measurements:

- Mitt circumference measured above the thumb: 6¼ (8)" (16 (20.5) cm) after seaming
- Length including cuff: 9½ (11)" (24 (28) cm) long

Yarn: Ewe Ewe Yarns, Baa Baa Bulky, 132 yards per 100g skein, 100% merino wool yarn, #5 bulky weight

- 1 skein or approximately 95 (132) yards

Needles: US 10 (6 mm) knitting needles

Supplies: 2 stitch markers, smooth waste yarn for holding sts, tapestry needle, clip ring stitch marker (optional), row counter (optional)

Gauge: 14 sts to 4" (10 cm) in stockinette stitch worked flat.

notes

To choose the best fitting mitt, measure the circumference of your hand around the knuckles and choose the size that is closest to your actual hand measurement.

You may wish to clip a locking marker to the RS of the project to differentiate the RS from the WS.

stitch glossary

inc - increased

k - knit

k2tog - knit 2 sts together (1 st decreased)

m - marker

m1L - make 1 left-leaning: insert the left hand needle under the running thread between the st just worked and the next st from front to back; knit this new st tbl (1 st increased)

m1R - make 1 right-leaning: insert the left-hand needle under the running thread between the st just worked and the next st from back to front; knit this new st (1 st increased)

pm - place marker

RS - right side

st(s) - stitch(es)

slm - slip marker

tbl - through back loop(s)

WS - wrong side

PATTERN

begin cuff

With the long tail cast on, loosely cast on 24 (30) sts.

Row 1 (WS): *K1, p1; repeat from * across.

Row 2 (RS): Knit.

Repeat [Rows 1 & 2] 5 (5) more times.

thumb gusset

Setup Row (WS): Purl.

Row 1 (RS): K11 (14), pm, m1L, k2, m1R, pm, k11 (14). [2 sts inc]

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K to m, slm, m1L, k to m, m1R, slm, k11 (14). [2 sts inc]

Row 4: Purl.

Repeat [Rows 3 & 4] until there are 12 (14) sts between markers.
[34 (42) sts total]

Next Row (RS): Remove thumb sts to waste yarn as follows: Knit to m, remove marker, place 12 (14) sts on waste yarn, remove marker, cast on 2 sts over gap using the backwards loop method, knit to the end of the row. [24 (30) sts]

palm and fingers

Setup Row (WS): Purl.

Row 1 (RS): Knit.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Repeat [Rows 1 & 2] until the mitt measures 8 (9½)" (20 (24) cm) from cast on edge or about 1½" (4 cm) less than desired length.

decrease for hand

Row 1 (RS): *K4, k2tog; repeat from * across. [20 (25) sts]
 Row 2 (WS): Purl.
 Row 3: *K3, k2tog; repeat from * across. [16 (20) sts]
 Row 4: Purl.
 Row 5: *K2, k2tog; repeat from * across. [12 (15) sts]
 Row 6: Purl.
 Row 7: *K1, k2tog; repeat from * across. [8 (10) sts]
 Row 8: Purl.
 Row 9: K2tog across. [4 (5) sts]
 Break yarn leaving a 15" (38 cm) tail. With tapestry needle, weave yarn through remaining sts and secure. Leave tail and move to Work Thumb.

work thumb

With RS facing, return sts held on waste yarn to needle from left to right.
 Row 1 (RS): Join yarn, pick up and knit 1 (2) st(s) from gap above thumb gusset, k12 (14). [13 (16) sts]
 Row 2 (WS): Purl across to the last 2 sts, p2tog. [12 (15) sts]
 Row 3: Knit.
 Row 4: Purl.
 Repeat [Rows 3 & 4] 2 (3) more times or until thumb measures ½" (1 cm) from desired length.

decrease for thumb

Row 1 (RS): *K1, k2tog; repeat from * across. [8 (10) sts]
 Row 2 (WS): Purl.
 Row 3: K2tog across. [4 (5) sts]
 Cut yarn, leaving a 7" (18 cm) tail. With tapestry needle, weave yarn through remaining sts. Using the mattress stitch, sew from tip of thumb toward hand. Darn opening. Weave in loose ends on WS of fabric.

finishing

With tapestry needle and using the mattress stitch, sew from tip of hand toward cuff. Finish off weaving in any loose ends.

second mitten

Work as for first mitten.
