SCHOOL & CURRICULUM

Oak Ridge High School (ORHS) is a ninth through twelfth grade, comprehensive public school. It is the largest of the four comprehensive and two alternative schools that serve approximately 6,500 students in the El Dorado Union High School District (EDUHSD).

Oak Ridge offers a diverse and rigorous curriculum including Advanced Placement (AP) courses, Regional Occupational Programs (ROP), award-winning fine arts, and trade and industrial education. Oak Ridge is approved and accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

Operating on a semester calendar with a modified block schedule, students take six year-long courses, with an option for a seventh. Each class earns five credits per semester.

ORHS also offers EDUHSD Online, a synchronous, independent study program, and Short-Term Independent Study Programs for students with 3 to 15 days of anticipated absences.

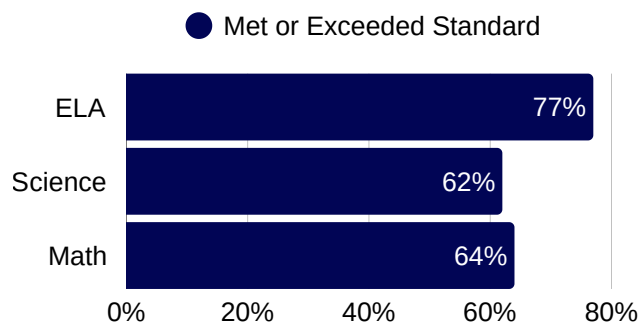

GRADING SCALE & CLASS RANK

Oak Ridge uses an A-F grading scale and a 4.0 weighted GPA system. All academic grades and total class enrollment are included in GPA calculations. Advanced Placement courses are weighted. Middle School and Dual Enrollment courses can be added to the transcript for elective credit, calculated on a 4.0 scale. If a course is repeated, the higher grade is used in GPA calculation. Class rank is no longer reported.

California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP)

ADVANCED PLACEMENT
