Goal #1: Establishing a High-Performing School Culture with Quality Learning:

- Student Learning & Achievement, Instructional Practices,
 - Assessment Results CCSPP Met or Exceeded Standard for Math & Reading (w/out 5th grade), all of our subgroups went up, IMPROVEMENT, in ALL sub-categories! WIN!
 -Overall, EL, Socioeconomically disadvantaged, disability, female, male, Hispanic, white, ...every subgroup makes growth. Go Murdock!
 - Academic interventions occur within the general education classroom as part of strong Tier 1 support. Teachers provide these interventions either immediately following direct instruction or in targeted small-group sessions to support students' mastery of grade-level content.
 - English Learner progress: Kate Niehues is doing an outstanding job organizing, communicating, and ensuring that all EL students are receiving their interventions. We faced a significant challenge this week with the loss of one EL teacher. Despite this, I am excited to collaborate with Mr. K on a plan to quickly recover and continue strengthening a proficient program for our largest student subgroup.
 - Behavior Interventions: We have many students making significant growth with support from our Behavior Aide, Rosa. She provides immediate, in-class support and is utilized by nearly every teacher daily. Rosa works tirelessly, supporting approximately 25-30 students each day, helping them remain engaged and in class.
 - Our Wellness Coach, Daniel, oversees the Nest, supporting students experiencing intense or too big emotions that disrupt learning. He helps them reset and return to class guickly. {There are many students and this system is successful.}
 - Protecting the core for reading & math, to ensure no students ever misses direct instruction of essential standards. No pull-outs, phone calls, or interruptions are made during the core. Every grade level has the same blocked time for ELA & Math core instruction..

*LCAP goal #2: All students have access to grade-level Learning. At-risk students will be identified by certificated staff & provided with academic support at each site.

All of our Common Assessments for Essential Standards are improving & strengthening our
 Tier 1 instruction for this year because we are "Protecting the core for reading & math."

Our PLC is based on data from common work, planning, & assessment from ONLY Essential
Standards. We refer to these Essential Standards as our BOULDERS. We ensure every student
knows their BOULDERS by the end of the year. {All means ALL.} All of our teachers are
well-versed on our grade-level boulders, rocks, and butterflies. Just ask them.

*LCAP goal #3: The schools will develop and maintain a systematic method for partnering with students, parents, county resources, and community members to improve student engagement.

- NVIH has been meeting with **all** of our identified students; we are currently at 20.
- Our 1st ever Grandparents Day (pastries & coffee)celebration was 9/26th.. PTO sponsored, Mercado donated 500 pastries for this event. After treats, the grandparents will go play on the playground with their grandchild.
