SCOE Celebrates 48th Annual Solano County Spelling Bee Finalists

Solano County, CA- Solano County Office of Education (SCOE) hosted the 48th Annual Solano County Spelling Bee for public and private schools serving 4th – 6th grade students. The countywide round was held on Saturday, March 2nd at Solano Community College in Fairfield and hosted 79 students from 41 schools.

First place went to sixth grader Kiaan Kahn from Holy Spirit Elementary School in Fairfield. Her winning word was "miscellaneous". Second place went to fifth grade student Zara Virk from Nelda Mundy Elementary School in Fairfield-Suisun Unified School District. The two winners were awarded trophies and will represent Solano County at the California Spelling Bee Championship held in San Joaquin County on April 27th.

SCOE's Associate Superintendent Manolo Garcia presented trophies to the finalists. He remarked, "Watching so many young students showcase their spelling prowess as well as their desire to continue learning is exciting. We are grateful for the remarkable amount of support from families, educators and our business partners which made this opportunity for students possible."
