Linda, Emily, Rebecca, Rick and Elia spoke in support of the resolution, shared their thoughts and requested that Resolution No. 88 be approved.

Board members provided feedback and thanked community members for their comments.

Motion No. 126, 2024-25, Motion by Mr. Yang, seconded by Ms. Ballerini and carried by a 6 to 1 vote of present board members that Resolution No. 88, recognizing June 2025 as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ+) Pride Month be approved. *Ayes: Albiani, Ballerini, Baulwin, Davis, Vargas, Yang; Nay: Moore; Absent: None*

IV. Student Expulsion/Involuntary Transfer Recommendations

1. Request for Student Expulsion – Motion No. 127, 2024-25, Motion by Mr. Yang, seconded by Ms. Albiani and carried unanimously by an affirmative vote of all board members present that the recommendation for student expulsion be approved.

V. Public Comment – For Items Not on the Agenda

Ret Pennel shared that she enjoys volunteering at her local school but still has concerns about bullying at the site and suggested that each classroom have a para-educator to assist students who need extra support.

Charlotte shared her concerns and frustration about the state mandated assessments and the forms associated with being excused from testing.

Macey C. and Gabrielle E. of Cal Fresh Healthy Living provided the Board with information about their program and the work they do with EGUSD students.

Mark Orozco shared his concerns about the random selection process for the offloading of Adreani Elementary students. He's concerned that his child and 54 other students will be offloaded and split up from their siblings. He asked that siblings not be split up.

Manuel Zapata, Sheet Metal Workers' Union Local 104, Communications Coordinator, introduced himself and shared information about Sacramento's Sheet Metal Workers' Training Center and invited the Board to their Open House on June 7th.

Grace Bailey shared her concerns about the disparities in the recent CAASSP results amongst black students and pointed out that advanced placement offerings are fewer than at wealthier school sites. Ms. Bailey also shared her concerns about the suspension rates amongst black students and suggested anti-bias and competency training for all school staff with follow-up.

Krystal Thomas thanked staff for the response from the district team. Recommended that the board consider reading: *Caste: Origins of our Discontents by Isabel Wilkerson*. Ms. Thomas shared that they will be meeting with the District and that she created an action plan for the meeting.
